\$1000.00 College Scholarships

Children and grandchildren of a Fosselyngen member in good standing are eligible for the college scholarships. A member in good standing is identified as being a Fosselyngen member for a minimum of two years and working a minimum of ten volunteer hours during those two years. Grade point average of a minimum of 2.5 is required. (We will also accept applicants with a 165 score (C+) in one of the four subject areas of the GED diploma.)

Guidelines for Sons of Norway Individual Volunteer Hours Worksheet

<u>Community</u> – An example of a community activity is: volunteering as part of a Lodge organized charity group. Include anything you do which has been organized by your Lodge and supports the people outside the Lodge.

Include any travel time associated with these activities in the time you record for them.

Do not record the time you spend at Lodge meetings, celebrations or any other group event.

For each activity, write down the date (if available), a description of activity and length of time you spent on the activity.
