FOSSELYNGEN LODGE VISIT TO HEG PARK ON JUNE 14, 2026

COLONEL HEG MEMORIAL PARK NEAR WIND LAKE IN THE TOWN OF NORWAY

Our lodge members visited Heg Park recently. We toured the museum and heard about the Norwegian migration to the Town of Norway in the 1830's – 1850's. It was a common stopping point for immigrants from Norway. Many then moved on to Dane County and elsewhere in western Wisconsin. The museum displays are excellent as well as the tour commentary by Marilyn who was an amazing resource of Norwegian immigration to the Muskego area.

Colonel Heg's family farm was about a mile north of the park. So Heg is truly a local boy. Heg was an active community leader before the Civil War, and he was a natural fit to command the 15th Wisconsin Infantry, often called the Norwegian Battalion. He was fatally wounded at Chickamauga in Tennessee in 1863.



The Muskego settlement leaders were members of Hauge religious group. I learned that many of the early settlers in Muskego from Norway were part of this movement which was challenging the formality of the Lutheran state church in Norway and intending to bring new life and vitality to the church.

Our lodge group also visited an 1837 restored log cabin. Our guide carefully led us to understand each of the historic pieces in the cabin.

The museum is open Saturday and Sunday afternoons during the summer. Stop in. It is well worthwhile.

There will be more about Col. Heg and the Muskego settlement in future newsletters.
