OSLO PLANS TO GO CARBON NEUTRAL BY 2030

Norway has plans to stop the sales of gas and diesel-fueled cars in the next four years, and the city of Oslo is working toward an ambitious goal of being carbon neutral by 2030. Here are a few of the initiatives currently underway in Oslo that will help the city meet its impressive goal.

Since transportation makes up the largest part of the city's carbon footprint, Oslo is promoting electric cars by creating new "low-emissions zones" where only electric cars can drive. The city is also removing parking spaces to add 40 miles of bike lanes. To promote biking even more, the city is providing grants for electric cargo bikes.

Businesses are also working diligently to support this initiative. Construction companies are purchasing new electricpowered equipment and will have to comply with a zero emissions standard for new building construction sites. A computer data center in Oslo pumps heat from servers into a heating system that heats approximately 5,000 apartments in the city. A newly built office space is encouraging their employees to go carbon neutral by including space for 500 bikes and 10 electric car charging stations.

If all goes according to plan, Oslo will be leading the way for other cities striving toward a carbon-neutral environment. (From Sons of Norway Newsletter Service)

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR 2019 YOUTH CAMP:

- DATES: SUNDAY, JULY 14TH AT 2:00 PM (check-in) THRU SATURDAY, JULY 27TH AT 9:30 AM, 2019. (A culminating program will follow for parents and other guests.) Application deadline is May 17th, 2019 for those who wish to qualify for further support through District 5 and Draxten Funds.
- **ELIGIBILITY:** District 5 youth, ages 9 to 15 (as of 1st day of camp, July 14th, 2019). Sons of Norway affiliation, while strongly encouraged, is not required for participation at Camp.
- **COST:** \$800.00.
- PAYMENT: A \$50.00 <u>non-refundable deposit</u> & processing fee is payable with application. Be certain to have a parent or guardian sign the form. Please mail to <u>Sandra Olson, District</u> <u>5 Youth Director, 733 250th Street, Woodville, WI 54028-7025</u>. Final payment is due on or before June 15th, 2019 and should also be sent to Sandra Olson. Make all checks payable to: <u>Nordic Legacy Foundation</u>. <u>Please print camper name(s) on all check</u> <u>memos</u>. Campers may make all camp fee payments via *PayPal* at <u>www.MasseMoro.org</u> or by check or a combination of both methods.
- MATCHING FUNDS: <u>Contact our LODGE SECRETARY (JANICE GREGOIRE, 262-784-6953) FOR INFORMATION ABOUT MATCHING FUNDS</u>. Our Lodge has voted to give matching funds of \$200 to each of two youths (early registration deadline is May 17th, 2019). District Five will also contribute UP TO \$150.00 to each of the two youths.

NOTE: For campers to receive additional monies from the Draxten Fund (that comes from S of N headquarters) toward their cost of camp, applications **MUST** be received by the early registration deadline of **May 17th**, **2019**. The amount of Draxten funding per camper is determined by the number of campers who have applied before the deadline.

FOSSELYNGEN GUIDELINES FOR YOUTH HERITAGE APPLICANTS AND MATCHING FUNDS:

- A. The Lodge will provide matching funds from its Masse Moro scholarship fund for two applicants.
- B. Application to be sent to our Lodge Secretary (Janice Gregoire).
- C. The applicant must be the child, grandchild, nephew or niece of a Lodge member in good standing. A member in good standing is identified as being a Fosselyngen member for a minimum of two years and working a minimum of ten volunteer hours during those two years.
- D. The applicant must provide one of the following after attending camp:
 - 1. A thank you and article written about his/her experience at camp that will be published in the Lodge newsletter. **OR**
 - 2. A presentation at a Lodge meeting about their experience at camp. They may also wish to bring photos and any type of project, e.g., rosemaling, hardanger, or wood carving.
- E. The applicant and his/her sponsor must sign a contract stating his/her obligations when applying for a scholarship to Heritage Camp.

Program: "SWEDISH WITCHES – FOLKLORE AND TRIALS".

According to Swedish Folklore, Maundy Thursday was time for Swedish witches (*häxor*) to grab their broomsticks from hiding to fly off to celebrate the Witches' Sabbath. Holy Saturday was time to fly back home to attend Easter Sunday service with everyone else in the village, but be careful not to say your prayers backward. 
Reservation deadline is Wednesday, March 27th. Remember to stock up on your parbaked. We need to make this special Sunday baking and delivery worth Reynold's time.

TRAILBLAZER WAS KNOWN FOR PRESERVING SVALBARD'S NATURE

Norwegian botanist Hanna Resvoll-Holmsen (1873 –1943) is known for paving the way for women in both academia and polar research. Often working alone, Hanna would take expeditions to Svalbard to study the archipelago and its historic sites and fossils. She crossed glaciers, climbed mountains and walked miles of shoreline to document arctic plants and fossils. Her efforts to preserve nature in Svalbard is why she is recognized as Norway's first nature and environmental conservationist.

Hanna was independent, resourceful, passionate and continuously pushed boundaries. She became the first woman to attain a doctoral degree in botany in Norway and the first female lecturer in phytogeography (the study of the geographical distribution of plants). She was also an accomplished photographer, and the first to capture Svalbard's plants in color.



Hanna was truly a pioneer for women of her time. As such, she was recently honored through art by Anne-Karin Furunes, displayed at the Fram Centre, Tromsø.
