## Program for April 12<sup>th</sup>: Presentation Via Zoom by Timothy Boyce About Odd Nansen's Secret Diary Written in a World War II Concentration Camp

Hailed by The New Yorker as "among the most compelling documents to come out of the war", *From Day to Day* is a World War II concentration camp diary—one of only a handful ever translated into English—secretly written by Odd Nansen, a Norwegian. Arrested in January 1942, Nansen, son of polar explorer and humanitarian Fridtjof Nansen (Nobel Peace Prize, 1922), was held captive in various Nazi camps in Norway and Germany. This inspiring diary brilliantly illuminates Nansen's daily struggle, not only to survive, but to preserve his sanity and maintain his humanity. After having been out of print for over 60 years, Timothy Boyce rescued the diary from oblivion after reading the memoir of another Holocaust survivor, whose life, as a 10 year-old boy, was saved by Nansen while both were prisoners in Sachsenhausen.

Through selected readings, Tim will explain who Nansen was, why he was arrested, why he wrote the diary, how he preserved it, and why this diary is as important today as it was when first written.

## The Story of Nina Hasvoll

From the Blog of Timothy Boyce (Reprinted Here by His Permission)

In 1938, following the Anschluss (See Note 1), Odd Nansen's relief organization, Nansenhjelpen, helped Jewish children travel from Vienna to attend summer camp in Norway. As conditions in Austria worsened, the children were allowed, reluctantly, to stay in Norway, at a Jewish Children's Home headed by one Nina Hasvoll, herself a refugee from Russia and Germany. The following year Nansenhjelpen brought children from Czechoslovakia to the children's home in Oslo as well. Nina continued to look out for her young charges in Oslo for several vears, until late 1942, when conditions for Jews in Norway worsened. On the morning of November 26, 1942, acting on a tip, Nina was able to spirit all of her 14 children away from the home a mere two hours before the Norwegian police arrived to round them up for deportation. [Virtually all the Jewish children who were rounded up were ultimately murdered in Auschwitz.] She helped the children escape to safety in Sweden with the help of several friends, a taxi driver and two border pilots, all of whom were later recognized as Righteous Among the Nations by Yad Vashem (See Note 2).



**Note 1:** "Anschluss" is the annexation of Austria into Nazi Germany on March 12<sup>th</sup>, 1938. **Note 2:** "Yad Vashem" is the World Holocaust Center in Jerusalem.

- He stood behind Franklin D. Roosevelt as he was sworn in at the White House in 1945. ٠
- Until 2012, he was the formal head of the Church of Norway.
- He holds an honorary Doctorate from Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma.

It was discussed that those who are able should start making winter hats and/or scarves for the homeless. These would be collected at the summer Lodge picnic for donation in the fall.

In the meantime, while we are busy sewing, knitting and crocheting, I would like to offer my Shorewood home as a location for items needed to help people through this winter's cold weather. I have found items in my home to share and will be making drops as I collect more items. You may find you have some unused necessities tucked away as well. Clean, lightly used, scarves, gloves, long underwear, coats, and unused hotel toiletries would be on a short list of necessities. Please see full wish list below.

#### **Cleaning & Sanitation Supplies:**

Bleach, Pine Sol, laundry detergent, masks, Lysol or generic disinfectant spray, large size gloves, and hand sanitizer.

#### Meal program:

8 oz disposable coffee cups w/lids, disposable soup bowls w/lids, three compartment to-go containers, utensils individually wrapped, sugar packets, creamer packets, and stir sticks.

#### **Clothing:**

Men's clothing (all sizes), women's clothing (all sizes), coats (men's and women's all sizes), blankets, men's and women's thermal under clothes, men's and women's boots (common sizes), sheets, and gloves.

#### Personal care:

Deodorant, individual soaps and shampoos, women's ankle socks, men's ankle socks, men's underwear (all sizes), bath towels and face towels, and hand warmers.

These donations will go to Repairers of the Breach, a shelter and social services organization located at 1335 W Vliet St.

I have a plastic bin on my porch to put your donations in. It keeps things out of the weather and allows for a no-contact drop off. - DATES: SUNDAY, JULY 18<sup>TH</sup> at 2:00 PM (check-in) thru SATURDAY, JULY 31<sup>ST</sup>, 2021. (On the final day a culminating program will start at 9:30 for parents and other guests.)
- ELIGIBILITY: District 5 youth\*, ages 9 to 15 (as of 1<sup>st</sup> day of camp, July 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021).
  \*Sons of Norway affiliation, while strongly encouraged, is not required for participation at Camp.
- COST: \$850.00.
- **CAMP APPLICATION FORMS** are available from our Lodge Secretary (Janice Gregoire), or get forms from the S of N District 5 website <u>www.sonsofnorway5.com</u> or <u>www.MasseMoro.org</u>.
- **PAYMENT:** Note change in dates for 2021 to better plan for staffing and camp programming.

**<u>Registration Deadline</u>: April 1, 2021**. A \$50.00 <u>non-refundable deposit</u> & processing fee is payable with application. Parent or guardian must sign this form.

- <u>Matching Funds Deadline to Apply is May 17</u>: <u>Contact our LODGE SECRETARY (JANICE GREGOIRE, 262-784-6953) FOR INFORMATION ABOUT MATCHING FUNDS</u>. Our Lodge has voted to give matching funds of \$500 to each of two youths (registration deadline is April 1, 2021). District Five will also contribute UP TO \$150.00 to each of the two youths.
- Application deadline is April 1, 2021 for those who wish to qualify for further support through District 5 and Draxten Funds. NOTE: For campers to receive additional monies from the Draxten Fund (that comes from S of N headquarters) toward their cost of camp, applications <u>MUST</u> be received by the registration deadline of April 1, 2021. The amount of Draxten funding per camper is determined by the number of campers who have applied before the deadline.
- Final Payment: Youth Director, Sandra Olson, will contact all applicants after receiving their registration fee, matching grant, first time campers, bring a friend, and any and all scholarships they received to establish final payment. Final payment is due on or before June 1, 2021 and should also be sent to Sandra Olson. Make all checks payable to: <u>Nordic Legacy Foundation</u>. <u>Please print camper name(s) on all check memos</u>. Campers may make all camp fee payments via *PayPal* at www.MasseMoro.org or by check or a combination of both methods.

#### APPLY NOW AS MANY CAMPERS HAVE ALREADY REGISTERED.

Bring a Friend: We encourage our youth to bring a friend! Campers who recruit a new camper and they both register by April 1, 2021 will also receive \$25 each toward their registration. Final payment is due on or before June 1, 2021.

#### FOSSELYNGEN GUIDELINES FOR YOUTH HERITAGE APPLICANTS AND MATCHING FUNDS:

- A. The Lodge will provide matching funds from its Masse Moro scholarship fund for two applicants.
- B. Application to be sent to our Lodge Secretary (Janice Gregoire).
- C. The applicant must be the child, grandchild, nephew or niece of a Lodge member in good standing. A member in good standing is identified as being a Fosselyngen member for a minimum of two years and working a minimum of ten volunteer hours during those two years.
- D. The applicant must provide one of the following after attending camp:
  - 1. A thank you and article written about his/her experience at camp that will be published in the Lodge newsletter. **OR**
  - 2. A presentation at a Lodge meeting about their experience at camp. They may also wish to bring photos and any type of project, e.g., rosemaling, hardanger, or wood carving.
- E. The applicant and his/her sponsor must sign a contract stating his/her obligations when applying for a scholarship to Heritage Camp.
