Hans Christian Heg

(Part 1 of 3)

Hans Heg's father, Even Heg, sold his hotel business in Drammen, Norway, and arrived in the area of Wind Lake with a party of immigrants on August 28, 1840. Heg, his wife Siri, and their four children stayed with an old friend, Soren Bache. Soon after arriving, Heg purchased the farm of John Nelson Luraas, located on the shores of Wind Lake. His log barn served as a hotel, church, and hospital. Hans Christian Heg was born on December 21, 1829. He was the eldest son of Even and Siri Heg. The Heg family farmed 320 acres, which were located between Wind and Long Lakes.

The farm established by Even Heg became a focal point for many Norwegians arriving in America. Many weary immigrants found a place at the Heg homestead to rest and gather information about their newly adopted country. Other immigrants worked on Norwegian farms in the Muskego area, earning enough money to buy land in western Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota.

To earn money, son Hans and his sister picked cranberries in the marshes nearby on the south edge of Wind Lake and sold them for a penny a quart in Burlington. Hans learned the English language and often accompanied his father Even Heg, who led immigrants to settlements at Koshkonong, Rock and Jefferson prairies.

MAMA ROSA WAUWATOSA'S NEW TROLL AT NEW FIREFLY GROVE PARK

Mama Rosa is the new 24-foot-tall troll created by the Danish artist, Thomas Dambo. The troll is made mainly from recycled wood. The "flowers" that she is holding (to resemble the flowers in Firefly Grove Park) are made from recycled old lamp posts obtained from the city of Wauwatosa. Note that the troll's name, "Mama Rosa", rhymes with "Wauwatosa".

Thomas Dambo has created more than 150 trolls located in 20 different countries around the world.

The park is located at the south east corner of the intersection of North 116th St. and Gilbert Ave. in Wauwatosa (north of the Wauwatosa Police Station at Walnut St. and about two blocks south of the traffic light at North Ave. and North 116th St.).

Note: Come by going south from North Ave. Don't come from the south at this time because of road construction at the intersection of North 116th Street and Watertown Plank Road.

There are walk-in entrances to the park from North 116th Street and from Gilbert Avenue.

Note: The new Wauwatosa park is appropriately named, as the city of Wauwatosa gets its name from the Potawatomi language, meaning "firefly".
