Culture Corner

Rhubarb came to Norway in the 1700s and was originally used as a medicine. As sugar became available in the 1800s, it found its way into the home kitchen. Many have mentioned the pleasure of dipping a stalk of rhubarb into sugar and eating it raw. If that doesn't appeal to you, this recipe for Norwegian Rhubarb Cake from Mollie and Dawn Bergsbaken will!

Rabarbrakake

- * 3/4 c Sugar
- * 3 Eggs, separated
- * 1/2 c Vegetable, or other neutral Oil
- * 1/4 c Milk
- * 3 c Rhubarb, chopped, divided
- * 1 t Baking Powder
- * 1 t Salt
- * 1 c All purpose Flour
- * 1 t Shortening
- ∗ 1/3 c Sugar
- * 1/3 c Butter, softened
- Powdered Sugar, optional

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a stand mixer, whip egg whites to firm peaks. In separate large bowl, mix egg yolks, oil and milk with a whisk. Add in 1-1/2 cups of the chopped rhubarb. With an immersion blender, blend rhubarb until incorporated into the liquids. Whisk in 3/4 cup of sugar, baking powder and salt. Add flour, 1/4 cup at a time, and mix well. Gently fold in egg whites. Lightly coat springform pan with shortening. Pour batter into pan. Add remaining rhubarb uniformly and allow it to sit on top. Sprinkle 1/3 cup of sugar over the rhubarb, and evenly spread butter over the top. Bake 45 minutes. Poke cake directly in the center with a toothpick. If it comes out clean, remove cake from the oven: if not, return to oven for another five minutes and try again. Repeat until done. Let cake cool in pan for at least two hours. Remove from pan, dust with powdered sugar and serve.
