The Bicentennial "Crossings" Celebrations in 2025

Preparations are well under way to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the first organized migration from Norway to North America! On the 4th of July 2025, the replica ship Restauration will set sail from Stavanger, arriving in New York Harbor on October 9th, exactly 200 years after the original tiny sloop (only 54 feet long!) made the extremely difficult voyage carrying the first group of 52 Norwegians. This was the beginning of a growing surge of emigrants who made the desperate decision to risk everything in order to find religious freedom and better living conditions in North America. About 800,000 people -- almost 1/3 of Norway's population -- left for "Amerika" during the next 100 years, changing both countries. Today, nearly 5 million people in the United States and Canada claim Norwegian ancestry. 
