Rosemaling Demonstration -Saturday, January 30, 2021- Time: 1:00 – 3:00 pm Central
If you need something a little different to do on a Saturday, join this demonstration via Zoom. Lois Mueller VGM, Vesterheim Gold Medalist, will be conducting a rosemaling demonstration. It will begin with a discussion of several different styles of rosemaling that Lois does, followed by a demonstration of one of the styles.

Lois has been rosemaling since 1977 and teaching since 1979. She began at the Technical College in Appleton, WI and now does travel teaching throughout the USA plus a trip to Taiwan and a couple to Canada. In November of 2020, she taught her first Zoom class for the Illinois Norsk Rosemalers Assoc. She received the Gold Medal from Vesterheim in Decorah, IA in 1998. Since that time she has written 9 rosemaling instruction books. In 2016, she was part of a group that created a new organization called, Rosemaling Coast to Coast. The reason for the organization was to have a way of sponsoring a rosemaling convention. They will be holding their 3rd convention, June 21-24, 2021 in Eau Claire, WI, providing Covid allows them to do so.

Lois would love to meet you at the demonstration and share some of the knowledge that she has gathered over her many years of rosemaling. There is no fee for the demonstration.

Virtual History Class

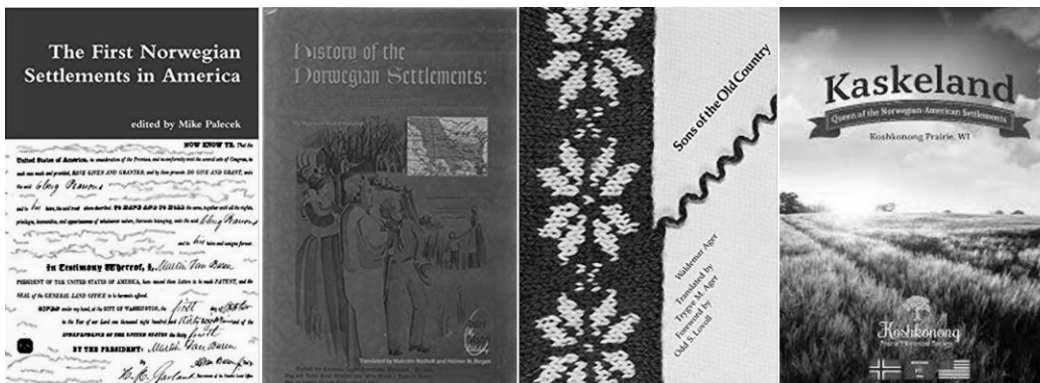
The Sons of Norway District 5 Norwegian-American virtual history course, **Norwegian-American Settlement in IL, MI and WI** will start with sessions offered on Saturday, January 23 (9:00-10:30 AM CT/10:00-11:30 ET) and Monday, January 25 (6:30-8:00 PM CT/7:30-9:00 PM ET). The course will be 16 weeks long.

- Weeks 1-3 will be an intensive overview of Norwegian-American history.
- Weeks 4-10 will cover frontier settlement history in Michigan, Illinois, Indiana and Wisconsin.
- Weeks 11-12 will be a "book club" format, where we will explore one of the best historical fiction books depicting Norwegian-American life.
- Week 13 will be dedicated exclusively to the Norwegian-American history of Michigan
- Week 14 will focus on special topics of interest in Norwegian-American history, such as inventors and interesting individuals.
- Weeks 15-16 will allow participants who choose to do a project an opportunity to make a presentation on their work.

Faculty include:

Bill Injerd, historian of The Sloop Society; Dave Johnson, president of the Norske Museum in Norway, Illinois; Dana Kelly, executive director of the Norwegian-American Genealogy Center; Mike Palecek, editor/author of *The First Norwegian Settlements in America*; Dave and Ruth Amundson, founders of The History Alive Project.

COVID-19 Updates and our lodge re-opening

- At this time, we are following the Dane County gathering restrictions which are ten people inside and up to 50 outside for events.
- Before we consider any food preparation, carry-outs or meals, we have to update all our worker agreement forms and have our COVID documents in place.
- We have applied for a Sons of Norway Foundation grant for PPE equipment such as hand sanitizing stations at all entries, a sneeze guard for the downstairs serving window, and Plexiglas barriers to use in the kitchen. Other items are likely needed before we can re-open.
- We continue to be without any fundraisers and will be discussing the lodge rent to the building corporation on the February business meeting call. Currently our monthly bills to keep the building running, utilities and licenses are about \$1,300. We lowered the rent last spring but may need to do that again.
- Our members, visitors and guests safety is our primary concern so we will cautiously consider in-person activities.
- We are following closely the rules at Dane County Public Health and encourage all members to do the same: <https://publichealthmdc.com/coronavirus>
