WHAT IS MASSE MORO?

Masse Moro is a Norwegian heritage camp for youth sponsored by the Sons of Norway Fifth District. Since 1979. it has been helping youth celebrate their Norwegian heritage and getting families connected to the Sons of Norway through its cultural immersion program. At camp, youth will learn the language, eat the food, listen to the music, tell the tales and myths, and celebrate the traditions of Norway.

ELIGIBILITY

Our camp is open to both boys and girls between the ages of 9 and 15 years old. (Campers must be 9 as of the first day of camp. No exceptions.) A two-week sleepaway camp, campers stay in cabins (furnished with bunk beds) along with 2-3 staff members and an additional 9-12 other campers. This small, cozy atmosphere creates a bonded tight-knit cabin that creates a home away from home where campers feel safe and comfortable.
