Many guests wore masks to prevent spread of the virus, but even with face coverings it was obvious that people were happy to have a chance to socialize in person again.



In Memoriam

Sadly, we experienced the passing of dear friends over the past two months:

Longtime Nordkap member **Howard Skovlund** of Farmington Hills passed away November 19, 2021, at the age of 98. A World War II veteran, he was the beloved husband of the late Anita, father of Cheryl (Frank) Quinn, grandfather of Jocelyn Jocque and Ryan Quinn, and great grandfather of Nathan and Adrian Jocque.

Howard was one of 11 children born in Bruce, South Dakota, to Ludvig and Minnie Skovlund. He grew up on a farm and attended a one-room schoolhouse through the 8th grade. He had to move away from home to go to high school and earn money to pay for his own schooling.

After graduation, Howard was drafted and served in the Army's 26th Division in Europe. He saw action in four major battles in France, Belgium, the Rhineland, and Germany. As part of a medical unit, Howard distributed medical supplies to aides who tended the wounded. For seven long months in combat, Howard's unit dealt with the wounded and dying. He narrowly escaped becoming wounded himself, when an enemy bullet slammed through a truck he was riding in -- right in front of Howard's face.

Once victory in Europe was declared, Howard's unit was re-assigned to distributing food to refugees in Austria. He was promoted to staff sergeant and was scheduled to join the fight against Japan in Burma. But before he left for that fight, the A bomb ended the war, and Howard came safely home to South Dakota where he earned a degree in electrical engineering from South Dakota State University.

He was employed as an engineer at several companies, including GM's Detroit Diesel Division, and eventually owned his own businesses. Howard was active in his church as a choir member and, in retirement, learned to play the banjo, performing with several groups.



During his 40-plus years as a Nordkap member, Howard served as president of Nordkap lodge from 1986-1987. In 2015, marking the 60th anniversary of the end of World War II, Nordkap's Bob Giles drove him in the Farmington Founders Day Parade, paying him honors as a WWII vet (see photo at left).

In recognition of Howard's many years of membership and service as an officer in Nordkap, the lodge is making a \$75 contribution to the Scholarship Fund in his honor.

Her greatest joy was spending time with her family, especially her granddaughters Natalie Vaal, Lindsay LaFave, and Erica Saunders, and great grandchildren Olivia and Lewis Vaal.

A Letter from President Erik Duus: Godt Nytt Ar! (Happy New Year!)

So are you a "new year's resolution" person? A lot of people are. If you're a member at a health club – for the first few weeks of any given year – you can't help but notice way more people using the equipment you want to use, than in, let's say, September.

I guess when it comes to setting goals or making plans, I fall somewhere between Woody Allen and Solomon from the Bible:

"If you want to make God laugh, tell him about your plans." – Woody Allen "We can make our plans, but the LORD determines our steps." – Proverbs 16:9 (NLT)

January is the month when many people "take inventory," not only of the previous year, but of their lives in general. I remember how excited our daughter, Lolly, was when she learned about, and completed, the Myers—Briggs Type Indicator personality assessment a few years ago. Lolly's an "ENFP" (Extroversion, Intuition, Feeling, Perceiving), and I'm an "INFP" (the same but I'm "Introversion"). For example, a few ideal "career matches" for Lolly would be entrepreneur, actor, teacher, and social worker, which make sense.

Have you heard of Gallup's "StrengthsFinder" (now called "CliftonStrengths")?

This strengths-based assessment has become very popular because it helps one discover one's natural talents & strengths, and then provides a report and resources to help live (and work) in those strengths.

There are <u>34 themes</u> divided into <u>4 categories</u>: **1. Strategic Thinking** (i.e. Analytical, Context, Futuristic, etc.); **2. Relationship Building** (i.e. Connectedness, Empathy, Positivity, etc.), **3. Influencing** (i.e. Activator, Maximizer, Woo, etc.); **& 4. Executing** (i.e. Achiever, Discipline, Focus, etc.).

While I highly recommend *Now, Discover Your Strengths* & *StrengthsFinder 2.0,* taking the online assessment was a HUGE "aha moment" for me, and would also be helpful for college students, people going through career change, or anyone wanting to improve their team or organization.

My wife, Kristin, and I went through the "StrengthsFinder" assessment with other leaders at our church 10+ years ago. We learned much about ourselves and each other. One glaring difference between us is that Kristin rates high in the "Context" theme; she enjoys pondering the past and understands the present by researching history. Conversely, I rate high in the "Futuristic" theme; I'm inspired by the future and what could be, and I [seek to] energize others with my vision of the future.

Thankfully, Kristin and I see the importance in *both* looking back AND looking forward. We're a good balance to each other, and the place we often meet – between the past and the future – is in the "present." **Nordkap Lodge "welcomes" 2022**, as we continue to learn from our past, prepare for our future, and live in the present.

I also "welcome" our new Board Members for 2022: Cathy Johnson, Magda Pecsenye, Eli Anita Steyskal, and David & Yana Thompson...and "tusen takk" to our entire Nordkap Lodge Board for your loving service to us all!

Important Updates from Our Zone 6 Meeting in November

Four Nordkap members attended the Zoom meeting on November 6, 2021, to hear the latest news affecting Sons of Norway, our District 5, and our Zone 6 of the district.

The virtual meeting was open to all Nordkap members. Attending for our lodge were President Erik Duus, Membership Secretary Carol Jehle, Magda Pecsenye (now Co-Cultural Director), and Editor and Publicity Director Louise Giles.

Highlights of the meeting included:

- Insurance regulators are behind Sons of Norway's upcoming plans to change its governance system from voting by delegates to direct voting by benefit members (those who own Sons of Norway financial products). An announcement of the governance changes is expected in the *Viking* magazine in early 2022.
- Andy Johnsen, president of District 5 for five years, will be stepping down after the district convention in Wisconsin this June.
- Mike Palecek, treasurer of District 5, will be running for district president.
- Lodges will need to elect delegates soon to attend the district convention.
- Lodges should explore alternate means like Zoom to reach members while we all try to stay safe from the coronavirus. Mike's lodge in Wisconsin requested people be vaccinated to attend their Christmas party.
- Recruiting new members and retaining existing members will continue to be important. Lodges need to find ways to make themselves visible to attract new members. Suggestions include picnics, special outings, bake sales, and promoting the benefits of memberships, such as noteworthy discounts. Look at the Sons of Norway District 5 Facebook page for additional suggestions.
- The District 5 Board of Directors approved a shipping grant for any lodges that have ordered membership pins for their members in 2021. This grant will continue to be in effect for successive years until revoked. [Editor's note: Nordkap's Carol Jehle was instrumental in getting the district to offer this.]
- Lodges with any special concerns should consult their zone director. Nordkap's zone director is Andy Johnsen.
- Another District 5 Zoom meeting will be scheduled after the holidays.

Sign Up for Classes in Creative Leadership offered by District 5

District 5 of the Sons of Norway is offering an 8-week Creative Leadership course, beginning on February 5 & 8. Each class will be 90 minutes long and will be offered on Zoom video conferencing. The leadership skills in the course will apply to all walks of life, but the discussion and examples will focus on leadership in local Sons of Norway lodges.

Participants can take either the 10 a.m. (Eastern Time) Saturday classes, beginning February 5, or the 7:30 p.m. (Eastern Time) Tuesday classes, beginning on February 8. Classes will wrap up at the end of March. There is no required reading. The fee for Sons of Norway members is \$25; for non-members, it's \$100.
