

President's Announcements:

- President Ken opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Al Bergh provided the prayer.
- Thank you notes from Norwegian National League for our syttende mai ad donation, and from Cleng Peerson Lodge for our help opening the Norsk Museum. Frances Berg thanked those who signed up to be a docent at the museum this summer. Some additional volunteers are still needed.
- Cleng Peerson Lodge will be celebrating its 50th anniversary on October 23, 2022, at the K of C in Ottawa, IL Guest speaker will be Susan Meyer, Norwegian Honorary Consul for Illinois. Please save the date so we can help them celebrate. Details soon.
- The annual Scandinavian festival at Vasa Park will be Sunday, September 11. Please start baking now.
- Sons of Norway Heritage weekend is October 7/8 in Spring Grove Minnesota.
- District 5 convention:
 - Our Polar Star lodge earned the National Gold Merit award in 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021.
 - Polar Star's newest delegate this year said she most enjoyed the culture classes and the music. Comments from other delegates included realizing that the national organization is divesting itself a number of responsibilities, such as culture medals and training, and passing them down to district levels. Seems to be moving toward a focus on finances rather than on cultural education.
- Floyd Anderson reported that his granddaughter's Masse Moro camp experience this year was hampered by Covid issues at the camp. She may be available to talk with us at our October lodge meeting.

The book for August is "Between Rocks and Hard Places", about traditions, customs, and conditions in Norway during the 1800s, emigration from Norway, and the Norwegian immigrant community in America. The book's author, Ann Urness Gesme, will be guest speaker.




