Jólabókaflód means "Christmas Book Flood". This tradition originated during World War II when imports from foreign countries were restricted, but paper was cheap. Iceland's population was not large enough to support a year- round publishing industry, so book publishers flooded the market with new books in the final weeks of the year. So, in Iceland, books are exchanged on Christmas Eve and the rest of the evening is spent reading your new book while eating your favorite chocolate!

As most of you know, your Culture Director loves Norwegian literature and encourages all of you to participate in this tradition. Bring your favorite book written by a Norwegian or Norwegian American author and a large chocolate bar to the December meeting and take home a new book for your Christmas pleasure.

When a tree dies on the property they have a wood carver come out and do his magic. There is a Viking that stands about six feet tall near the Fox River. The most recent sculpture is a troll (pictured).

September – we all know what happens then – Scandinavian Day

Every time we attend an event at the Park, something else has been improved. They are constantly taking care of the property and improving when finances are available.


Hopefully Frank and I will start seeing Polar Star members at future Vasa Park events.





Sons of Norway District 5 Adult Culture Weekend "Celebrating Norwegian Immigration"

The Slooper's 200th Anniversary
October 3-5, 2025

2025 marks the 200th Anniversary of the first organized emigration of Norwegians to the United States. The single mast sloop, Restauration, left Stavanger on July 4, 1825, with 52 people on board. Often referred to as the "Sloopers," they arrived in New York City harbor on October 9, 1825.

The coordinated undertaking for the 200th anniversary has been identified as **Crossings**, **Norway & North America**, **1825 – 2025**. The Crossings Bicentennial in North America is managed by a group of dedicated professionals representing numerous organizations that include the Norwegian American Historical Association (NAHA), Vesterheim Norwegian-American Museum, Norway House, *The Norwegian American* newspaper, with representation from Sons of Norway and the Sons of Norway Foundation.

Editor's Note: Please mark your calendars and plan to attend and volunteer your time as we "Celebrate Norwegian Immigration" and the 200th Anniversary of the Sloopers arriving in America. The following is the working schedule for the 2025 Culture weekend being planned for the fall of 2025. The planning committee is focusing on providing participants with the history and culture of early Norweigan American pioneers that settled and established farms and communities on the prairie of LaSalle County, Illinois.
