President's Message June 12th, 2024

Dear Members,

We had a great meeting and program in May to celebrate Syttende Mai. Daryl Wunrow did a great job with his extensive research and presentation about Olav Eide, a past member and past District 5 President of Sons of Norway. His son Erik Eide said he learned things about his Dad that he didn't even know. We also enjoyed a delicious Norwegian dinner of Lapkaus (Norwegian stew with beef tips). Thanks to the members Arlette Johnson, Nancy Sande, and Kath Holmes who baked Norwegian cookies to add delight to our ice cream cup dessert and all who helped with set up, serving and cleaning up.

We have been notified by the Sons of Norway home office that our dues will be increasing on July 1st, 2024. They explain that they haven't increased dues since 2018, while inflation has increased 21% and that our dues don't cover the expenses of doing business. Our board has discussed how this increase may be a hardship for some members and have voted for our local lodge to reimburse members the increase amount after you make your annual payment. A single member dues will be \$84.00 (an increase of \$24) and a family membership will be \$144.00 (an increase of \$48). If you renew after July 1st and pay the annual premium, Gretchen Bjork, our Treasurer, will see your name on the renewal report, and she will send you a check for the \$24 or \$48.00 increase. We will not be able to accommodate monthly payment plans unless you wait until you pay the higher monthly payment for 12 payments. Golden Members' dues are slightly less, and they will receive a check for the increased amount of their dues as well. This is another benefit of your membership with Fosselyngen! You are a valued member!

Our lodge picnic is Monday, July 8th at 5PM at the home of members Dave and Victoria Christianson, 3435 Cardinal Dr., Brookfield, WI 53005. Brun Lapskaus (Norwegian Beef + Vegetable Stew)

Lapskaus is a traditional Norwegian stew, usually made with beef and root vegetables. It tastes even better the next day!

Prep Time: 15 minutes Cook Time: 1 hour and 45 minutes Total Time: 2 hours

Servings: <u>4</u>

Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 and ³/₄ lbs beef (stew quality I used chuck steak)
- 1 onion
- 3 cups beef stock
- 1 small rutabaga
- 1 celery root
- 4 carrots
- 4 parsley roots
- 1 lb potatoes
- ½ leek
- fresh parsley (garnish)

Instructions

Heat olive oil in a large pot. Cut beef into 1 inch (2.5 cm) cubes and brown in oil.

Dice the onion and add to browning beef. Add the stock and bring to a boil, then lower the heat, cover, and let simmer for about 30 minutes.

Peel and cut the rutabaga and celery root into 1 inch (2.5 cm) cubes. Add to the pot, cover, and continue simmering for another 30 minutes.

Peel and chop the rest of the vegetables into 1 inch (2.5 cm) cubes and add to the pot. Slice the leek into rings. Cover and continue simmering for about 20 minutes. Stir as little as possible. Top with fresh parsley.

Crossings 200: Bicentennial Commemoration of Norwegian Migration to America

A large effort is underway, both in Norway and North America, to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the first organized direct emigration from Norway to America in 1825. Many groups are developing activities to raise awareness and understanding of Norwegian emigration and history to strengthen the bonds and networks of Norwegians abroad and in Norway.

On July 4, 1825, a group of 52 Norwegians set sail on the ship *Restauration* to make the first organized migration from Norway to North America. Since that first voyage, nearly a million people have followed, leaving their homes in search of opportunities and a better life. While many returned to Norway, most remained and built new homes and lives for their families in the United States and Canada. Today, nearly 5 million people in North America claim Norwegian ancestry- almost as many people that live in Norway today.

A website dedicated to the bicentennial was launched on March 5, 2024 [Velkommen — Welcome - Crossings (norwegianamerican.com)] in coordination with the Norwegian Emigrant Museum [2025 - Norsk utvandrermuseum (utvandrermuseet.no)] located near Hamar, Norway. The website provides information, resources and calendar of events for the bicentennial commemoration. Groups may register their events on the website, which is serving as a hub for the bicentennial commemoration.

Examples of activities include plans for a replica ship to sail from Stavanger on 4 July 2025 to New York City arriving 9 October (Leif Ericson day) and a conference June 18-22 at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. The Norwegian-American Historical Association (NAHA), Det norsk-amerikanske historielaget i Norge (NAHA-Norge), the Norwegian Teachers and Researchers Association of North America (NORTANA), and the Norwegian Department at St. Olaf College will co-host a conference commemorating 200 years of Norwegian migration to/from North America. The multi-day event will offer a variety of experiences that will appeal to scholars and researchers of Norwegian migration as well as the general public, including Norwegian-American music, dance, historic sites, and more. More information is forthcoming, including a call for papers, registration, lodging, pre- and post-conference excursions, and more.

Cooperation in the Valdres region

There was a presentation in February this year from the 2025 bicentennial committee to the board of the regional organization Valdres Historical Society and members of the local historical societies in each of the Valdres municipalities. The organizations are now in the process of planning a new organization structure with Valdres Historical Society as an umbrella organization and hopes that activities tied to the bicentennial on emigration in Valdres could unite the new organization in a common activity.

Crossings commemorates 200 years of organized Norwegian migration to North America. 2025 will be a year to celebrate the strong ties between Norway, the United States, and Canada. It's an opportunity to remember what it means to take great risks and trade one home for another. And it's a chance to better understand the movement of peoples that continues worldwide today.
