


#### PRESIDENTEN HAR ORDET

## October 2024 Board Meeting Minutes

Monday, October 14, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 1:12PM on October 14 by President Dave Hirschey. Present were Dave Hirschey, Sue Strohkirch, Oleif Olsaker, Darlene Henderson, Jim Nelson, and Ann Thorvik.

Minutes from the September Board Meeting were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Oleif Olsaker provided the Treasurer's Report, including September transactions, and confirmed the Lodge is still "in the black."

FRIENDSHIP GARDENS UPDATE: Oleif will have a follow-up discussion with his contact at the International Friendship Gardens in Michigan City to discuss membership status, communication, and benefits. Hugh Hopkins has identified a new log and is making plans to retrieve and store it for winter 2024-2025 carving of a new Viking statue

for placement in Friendship Gardens. Artist renderings and pattern creation is underway. Costs for chainsaw carvers are quite high and local carvers have expressed interest in doing the work themselves. Darlene Henderson has offered tools and assistance in coordinating these efforts.

SEPTEMBER PROGRAM REVIEW: Jim Nelson reviewed the September 21 Lodge event at the LaPorte County Historical Society Museum, which was attended by fourteen members and guests. The event was enjoyable, although having additional opportunities for seating or rest during the tour would have been appreciated.

OCTOBER PROGRAM: The Scandiana Lodge's Foundation Auction will be held on October 26 in the B. Woods room of Chesterton's Main Library. Dennis Lindborg will act as auctioneer and Sidsel Lindborg will coordinate auction logistics (paddles, tracking, payments). The Lodge and SON Foundation split proceeds 50/50, and this is a great opportunity to generate revenue. Special items to be auctioned include an original painting from Mark Zimmerman, an original woodcarving from Darlene Henderson, and a selection of Scandinavian items from Jim Nelson. Members should bring items to contribute to the auction and should be reminded that the auction accepts only cash or checks. In addition to the Foundation Auction, attendance medals will be distributed.

NOVEMBER PROGRAM: The Scandiana cookie exchange will occur on November 23. A program suggestion, via Hugh Hopkins, was to ask attendees to share how they plan to keep their heritage's traditions alive this holiday season.

2025 PROGRAMMING SUGGESTIONS: On the heels of the LaPorte visit, potential future programs including visits to the Porter County Museum in Valparaiso or the Westchester Township History Museum in Chesterton were discussed. The Westchester Public Library's YouTube channel contains an 8-part series entitled, "Duneland's Swedish Immigrants" as well as a "Making Swedish Ornaments" video. Serena Ard, Westchester Township History Museum Curator, will be approached regarding these videos as well as any other resources in their collection. Hugh Hopkins has been investigating the trove of materials saved and organized by Eva has potential to be developed into an "Exploring Eva's Attic Treasures" program. Rather than a full language course, Jim Nelson suggested more practical and less daunting, conversational Norwegian (or Swedish) lessons. Sue Strohkirch is investigating some program materials available through Vesterheim's Folk Art School programs. There was discussion of attempting better coordination with the Parks Department to minimize overlaps between Lodge meetings and Parks Dept schedules for Scandinavian Christmas at Chellberg Farm and Midsommer celebrations.

2025 MEETING SCHEDULE: Per Dave Hirschey, confirmation of the 2025 meeting schedule should occur shortly after the October 21 arrival of a new contact person at the Library.

BOARD MEETING ATTENDANCE: Discussed opportunities to improve attendance at Board meetings, including use of Zoom (or similar) platform for video or call-in participation.

MEMBERSHIP UPDATES: The Board shared member updates, address changes, actions to engage prospective members, and newsletter distribution updates.

2025 SLATE OF OFFICERS: The Board assigned follow-up tasks in efforts to secure a slate of officers for 2025. These final communication updates are expected to be complete before the October 26 meeting.

FACEBOOK: The new Scandiana facebook page is active and is receiving great reviews. Should discuss with Mark Zimmerman how he would like to handle contributions from members (post and have him approve or send to him for entry and posting).

The next scheduled Executive Committee meeting is November 18, 2024 at 1:00PM at the main library. Meeting was adjourned at 3:00pm.

Dennis Lindborg auctioned items donated by members and Irene Nelson and Sue Strohkirch recorded sales. October is Foundation month for scholarships and such. Half of the auction profits will be sent to the Home Office Foundation, and the other half is deposited in the lodge treasury. The total collected was \$530.00. (1/2 is \$265.00)

The meeting was adjourned at 3PM.
