

Vennelag members will welcome back Eric Dregni at the September 30<sup>th</sup> meeting. Dregni, a Minneapolis native, is the dean of the Italian Concordia Language Village. He is an assistant professor of English and journalism at Concordia University and has authored 16 books including the titles: Vikings in the Attic, Never Trust a Thin Cook, Other Lessons from Italy's Culinary Capital, Midwest Marvels, and Minnesota Marvels.

In one of his latest books, For the Love of Cod: A Father and Son's Search for Norwegian Happiness, Dregni takes the reader on a journey to find Norway's supposed bliss which makes for a comic travelogue that asks, seriously, what makes Norwegians so damn happy!

The words, *Jeg elsker deg*, were spoken even more than usual across Norway in 2020. The upside of the COVID-19 pandemic is an increase in Norwegian births! The increased births were noted almost exactly 9 months after Norway closed on March 12, 2020. The birthrate in Nordland fylke rose 20%, in the first half of 2021. This is especially good news for this county, as many residents has previously moved to urban areas. Other fylke birthrates rose to 8.3% in Agder, 6.3% in Rogaland, 5.7% in Møre og Romsdal, and 4.5% in Oslo. Prior to this year, Norwegian births were fueled by immigration but last year immigration came to a halt.

Among adults in Norway, 87.8% have received the first vaccine dose, and 51.7% have been fully vaccinated. A total of 41.1% of the total population in Norway has been fully vaccinated against COVID-19, while 69.9% have received the first vaccine dose.

A total of 3,756,885 Norwegians received the first dose, and 2,218,347 people received the second dose, figures from the FHI show on Saturday.

Update: Norway is set to receive 1 million new doses of the Moderna vaccine because Poland no longer needs them. With that, adult Norwegians could be fully vaccinated by mid-September.

At the same time, the reopening timeline is being accelerated. "With this delivery, all adults over the age of 18 will be fully vaccinated during the first two weeks of September. That means that Norway can return to a more normal everyday life more quickly," Prime Minister Erna Solberg (H) noted.

# FROM THE NORWEGIAN AMERICAN, 7-9-2021 Two campers find NOK 2 million in a cave

Two campers in southeastern Norway searching for a suitable camping spot stumbled upon an unexpected discovery. The two men who were searching a good camping spot near Mossemarka in Viken County reached a memorial site where the Norwegian resistance stored weapons and equipment during WWII.

About two football fields away Ole Bisseberg and his friend spotted something unusual behind a rock. The curious friends began to look around to see if there were any exciting artifacts left behind. Stumbling upon a tiny cave, they discovered a bag with four large wads of cash wrapped in duct tape.

The banknotes date back to 1999, and the accompanying bag showed signs of weathering, as if it had been hidden there for quite some time. The money was turned over to the National Criminal Investigation Service. (*Frazer Norwell/The Local*)


**Nordic Walking Group Forming**

# **Norway's Olympic Games**



Norway competed at the 2020 Summer Olympics in Tokyo. Originally scheduled to take place from 24 July to 9 August 2020, the Games were postponed to 23 July to 8 August 2021, because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Since the nation's debut in 1900, Norwegian athletes have appeared in every edition of the Summer Olympic Games, except for two occasions: the 1904 Summer Olympics in St. Louis and the 1980 Summer Olympics in Moscow, due to the country's support for the United States-led boycott.
