The more well known types of rosemaling are: Telemark, Hallingdal and Rogaland

...but then, there's Os. It seems to be a lesser known style of rosemaling. I'm going to demonstrate Os at the next meeting. I'm no pro, but I'd love to share the bright, simple style of Os. We will start with brush strokes. Then I've got a simple flower for everyone to try. There's no need to have experience. We are just going to keep it simple to start and have fun. I'll guide us towards a cultural pin for this activity.

Why I like Os:

I'm currently in Texas as I write this. Texas is where I was born and raised. During this trip home, I'm reminded of the bright colors and flair that are largely an influence of the Hispanic culture.



Shrimp Canapés (serves 4)

16 slices bread
1/2 cup mayo
1/4 cup butter, softened
1 small jar capers
1 lemon, sliced in half moons
4 large sprigs fresh dill
20 boiled, cold shrimp, preferably still in the shell or head on

Boil the shrimp. Mine were jumbo and took 7-8 minutes. (Small shrimp will only need 3-4 minutes). Shock in ice water to keep them from overcooking. Drain.

Lay out all ingredients in a DIY spread. Instead of using traditional white bread, I used slices of soft wheat bread cut into dainty circles with cutters. I loaded my canapes up with the salty capers, a splash of lemon juice and a sprig of dill. It was fun assembling each sandwich.

Be sure to provide plenty of napkins, sparkling water, and enough smiles to light up the room.
