Move over Burgundy and Rioja. Bjørn Bergum and his partner Halldis make wines on the shores of Norway's longest fjord. At 61 degrees north, they're well outside the traditional grape-growing band of 30-50 degrees of latitude — but Bjorn remembers the fjord freezing over when he was kid, and that never happens now.

Climate change has pushed winemakers farther north in the northern hemisphere and farther south in the southern hemisphere. Bergum wants to enter his wines in international competitions, provided the tastings are blind: "If they knew the wine came from Norway, they would probably not taste it at all." (Source: BBC)

Knut Brakstad—A Career of Service

Knut Brakstad - A Career of Service

Knut Brakstad built a career in service to his country, eventually becoming the right hand of the king. Originally from Molde, he attended St. Olaf College in the U.S. The liberal arts curriculum allowed him to explore interests such as civic engagement, philosophy and theology. He studied in Germany and London; in Oslo he earned degrees in family therapy and theology.

Brakstad was a chaplain in the Royal Norwegian Navy, worked for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and served as a Lutheran minister. He was a project manager on the 1994 Winter Olympics in Lillehammer and then shifted careers, moving to the royal palace to become the First Assistant Cabinet Secretary for King Harald V.

Eventually Brakstad became the king's private secretary, responsible for maintaining King Harald's correspondence, schedule and activities, flying with him all over Norway and the world. For his service to his country, Brakstad was appointed a Knight of the Order of St. Olav in 2005, and was awarded an honorary doctorate by his alma mater, St. Olaf College. He retired in December 2021, after 28 years of representing the royal family.





Norwegian Film Nominated for Oscar: "Verdens Verste Menneske"

In October 2021, the Norwegian film "Verdens Verste Menneske" was released in France and Norway. The film, which translates to "The Worst Person in the World," has been a hit and has since been released in the USA in early February 2022. In fact, the film has been nominated for an Oscar in the "Best Foreign Language Film" category by The Academy of Motion Pictures and Sciences in Hollywood.

This is not the film's first praise, however. The film has already won "Best Foreign Film" at the New York Film Critics Circle in December, making it the first-ever Norwegian film to win. In the lead role, Renate Reinsve has also been in the spotlight since the film's premiere as she won "Best Actress" at the Cannes Film Festival. The film depicts her character finding her way through life and love.

This is the sixth time Norway has been nominated for an Oscar in that category, however all previous nominations have not been the winners. Sadly, it was not in the cards for "Verdens Verste Menneske" this year. The award went to the film "Drive My Car" from Japan.

Lingonberry Cake

<u>For the Cake</u> Scant 2 cups flour 2/3 cup sugar 1 Tbsp. baking powder Scant 2/3 cup unsalted butter 1 egg 3/4 cup lingonberry preserves

<u>For the Streusel Topping</u> 2/3 cup oatmeal 3 Tbsp. butter 1/2 cup sugar 1 tsp. vanilla sugar (or 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract)

Preheat the oven to 400°F. Combine flour, sugar, and baking powder then cut in the butter with pastry blender. Add the egg and mix well. Spread into a greased 8" x 12" pan. Spread the preserves over the batter. Mix streusel topping together using a pastry cutter or two knives and sprinkle over lingonberry preserves.

Bake 25-30 minutes, until golden. Cool in the pan.
