CREAMY RICE PUDDING

- Serves 8-12 —

INGREDIENTS:

6 cups milk

1 cup (white) rice uncooked,

DIRECTIONS:

Heat to the boiling point (in a $4\frac{1}{2}$ quart Dutch oven or pot) Stir in the rice, cover, and simmer for about 20-60 minutes, until the rice is tender and the milk is absorbed.

While the rice is simmering:

8 oz cream cheese, softened

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla

Cream the sugar, egg, and vanilla into the cream cheese.

When the rice is done, stir the cream cheese mixture in to the rice and cook for another 5 minutes.

If you want to add raisins, add 1 cup

Sprinkle 1 tsp nutmeg on top of the rice pudding in a serving bowl. Serve warm or cold.


