We hope you will continue to be motivated to exercise to be healthy.


MOTHER'S DAY IN NORWAY

It's a celebration that honors mothers, motherhood and maternal bonds. The idea started in America when a woman called Anna Jarvis held a small memorial service for her own mother on 12 May, 1907, two years after she had died. The day is an American invention, but it has taken root in Norway.

In Norway, Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday in February, this year the celebration will take place on Sunday, February 14. The United Kingdom celebrates Mothering Sunday in March, Luxembourg honors their mothers in June and Russia rejoices for moms in November. However, Norway is the only country to celebrate Mother's day in February, and although the day lies so closely to Valentine's Day, Mother's Day remains the most important holiday of the month. February is undoubtedly the busiest month of the year for flower shops in Norway, and some women will be lucky enough to get flowers twice!

In Norway, Mother's Day was first celebrated in Bergen on February 9th, 1919, and was initially organized by religious organizations. Since then Mother's Day has evolved into more of a family day. There are no specific traditions associated with the day, but in many homes mothers are typically served with breakfast in bed and accompanied with gifts, flowers and cake.
