Yew tak yust ten big potatoes
Den yew boil dem till der done

an' vit two fingers pinch o' salt
yew beat dis very lightly

Speaking of baking there is an ingredient that you may not have heard about called Hartshorn. This ingredient was made from the antlers of the deer family in the Middle Ages from male deer or hart as they were known then and believe it or not it helps keep your crispy delicious treats crispy but slightly chewy. Now in modern times we call this ingredient Bakers' Ammonia or ammonia carbonate which is very correct description as it does really smell like ammonia and will stay in your nose for many hours after you first take off the lid to use the ingredient. Oddly once you bake your treat the ammonia smell dissipates a bit although it can still have a slight ammonia smell and there is a different flavor. However this ingredient cannot be just added into any recipe but if need it for a recipe and you don't have it no worries —you can use regular baking powder just use twice what the recipe calls for Hartshorn. Note that this should not be confused with cleaning ammonia —that is a different chemical and should never be eaten/drank.

Can you believe that we were tired of snow?

Have you ever had a problem getting your cows down from the alpine pastures that they have ensconced themselves in for the day? The Scandinavians have a solution – Kulning or sometimes called Kulokk (depends on the Norwegian or Swedish side of the peninsula you are from) this is a calming vocal melody that usually the herder (a young female if we are talking



prior to the late 1900's) that is very huldra-esk in the way it pulls the animals into coming to them.

Back before the technology that we have today- Kulning served as a way for herders to talk to each other without being within visual distance (the Swiss used yodeling and alphorn playing in this way as well). Also the animals were conditioned to the tone of their herder so they could find their herder if the animal became lost. Many of the songs were and are still handed down from one singer to another, and in true folk style -they are not written down but are learned by ear only. More recently there has been a need or want to write down the music, many times now the students will also record either by audio or video so that they can either pass down that to the next generation or preserve the melody. By recording the melody the students also try to emulate the phrasing or technique that the teacher has and can practice without the teacher since our modern lives are becoming increasingly full.


