### Vafle Day on St. Patrick's Day!

But in the true Norwegian spirit, the Vafle Day celebration was a big success! Thank you to all who brought waffles or supporting side dishes.

Here is a waffle recipe the Irish/Norwegians in the group enjoyed:

#### Gingerbread Waffles:

- 3 cups flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon cloves
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 eggs
- 2/3 cup white sugar
- 1 1/2 cup milk
- 1 cup molasses
- 1/2 cup of butter melted

Measure and combine dry ingredients into a large bowl. Into a separate bowl, beat the eggs and sugar together until thick and foamy. Stir in milk and molasses. Add liquid to dry ingredients stir until well combined. Fold in melted butter. Use about a third of a cup batter into a heart waffle maker.

Children figure prominently in the events, especially in leading the parades. Initially, dating back to 1869, only boys were able to march. The girls' participation was not far behind – within 20 years they, too, enjoyed waving their flags as the parades wove through the streets of Norway and beyond.

Grilled sausage, Wienerpølser (wiener sausage) and regular hot dogs are so popular on May 17 that retail grocers have reported a huge bump in sales on the holiday. "Eat what you like" is the mantra for the day. Indulging in that manner is a big part of the celebrations. Enjoy the day, no matter how you choose to celebrate. Happy Syttende Mai to all!



The first class will be a rosemaking class taught by Lois Mueller of Platteville. She is a Vesterheim gold medalist, and some Vennelag members have previously taken one of her classes. This class is scheduled for [Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup>](#). If you have unfinished projects, consider completing them under Lois's tutelage. Miscellaneous supplies will need to be purchased along with wooden ware and brushes, but Lois will provide the paints. Her fees are yet to be determined.
