Lefse and Holiday Bake Sale - December 18



We will be holding a lefse and bake sale, and I am asking your family to make some items for that purpose. We are encouraging everyone to provide Norwegian items, so we can share the customs and traditions which are linked to our heritage.

Please be aware of food allergies, especially with nuts. <u>If there are nuts in your baked items</u>, <u>please indicate that.</u>

HELP IS NEEDED AT THE ELC CHURCH ON DECEMBER 15 and 16 TO MAKE LEFSE.

We will work from 9 AM TO 4 PM; standing for a length of time may be necessary.

We will be making a lot of lefse, so we need a lot of help. One hundred pounds of potatoes will be used. The more rollers and bakers we have, the quicker this process will be. If you can help make lefse, we encourage you to come and help us. We need people who can roll, flip, cool, package and price the lefse. If you have your equipment: griddles, sticks, or rolling pins, please bring them.

We will take a lunch break partway through the day. Sandwiches, plates, napkins, silverware and beverages will be provided. If you want to bring items for lunch, that would be welcome. There will be plenty of coffee provided.

The District 5 Board of Directors met at the Madison West Marriott Hotel in Middleton the weekend of October 8-9, 2021. A joint meeting with the D5 2022 Convention Committee from Idun Lodge and the Director of the Edvard Grieg Chorus of Madison, was held. This hotel will be the site of both gatherings from June 16-22, 2022. Our delegates and guests will have the opportunity to attend the Sangerfest Grand Concert.

In business news, several approved grants to local lodges were passed by the D5 Board. Grants for the shipping costs of membership (anniversary), cultural, and sports pins will now be subsidized. Lodges will need to provide proof of purchase. The grants are limited.

In addition, several matching grants will also be available to local lodges for small and large cultural projects. A budget for the projects must be submitted with the application. I encourage the Vennelag cultural, sports, and membership chairs to use these windfalls to offset costs. Local leaders need to watch the Friendly Fifth Friday Newletter for further details and the application posting.

A long requested adult heritage camp weekend has been confirmed for October 2022 with the Giants of the Earth Center in Spring Grove, MN. It will be held in conjunction with UffDa Fest! An event will be held in association with Valheim Lodge of Spring Grove. This will be a perfect way to celebrate our heritage with others who share our bond.
