## September 28<sup>th</sup> Meeting Details:

*Crown Princess Martha, The American Story*: Not a Power Point but a 52 min. video produced by the Norwegian government on the occasion of her statue erected in front of Norway's embassy in Washington DC in 2005. Between the story of her early life as a Swedish princess, her courtship and marriage to Olav and her tragic death in 1954, is the tale of their tenth anniversary trip to the USA. This was an extensive journey covering our nation from Niagara Falls to the Grand Canyon and also their meeting FDR with an invitation to America should the situation in Europe worsen. It did within a year and Martha and her three children did spend five years in America, hosted by the Roosevelts. A prequel to the PBS series *The Atlantic Crossing*!

Questions and discussion of *The Atlantic Crossing* would be appropriate at the conclusion of the video.



David Amdahl is the son of a Norwegian immigrant. His father, Olaf came from the Stavanger area to North Central Iowa in 1927. He and his wife Jill are also the parents of an emigrant as their daughter, Staci, moved to Norway in 2008. Staci now lives with her husband Espen, and daughters, Ariel and Harley, near Trondheim. David spent most of his working life in the farm equipment industry, the last fifteen at Northeast Iowa Community College teaching Agricultural Equipment Technology. Since retirement in 2005 he has spent time volunteering as a guide at Vesterheim, visiting family and grandchildren and reading considerable history. He enjoys sharing

programs involving little known historical events and facts that he has discovered through his travels and reading.

He began traveling to Norway with his father in 1980 and hasn't been able to stop. A visit in April 2019 with wife Jill, to Staci, Espen and family was the sixteenth. And if anyone has the ticket, he would be on his way again.....tomorrow morning!

I would like to perhaps provide a little clarification. I would not really describe it as being a presentation of Martha and *the Atlantic Crossing* but rather, perhaps a prequel. It was made as a tribute to her by the Norwegian Embassy in Washington D. C. on the occasion of the unveiling of a statue on the embassy grounds. It begins with her life as a Swedish Princess and continues with her marriage to Olaf. (Some real good royal family history there) The majority covers their 10th anniversary trip to the USA where they meet the Roosevelts and that sets up the Atlantic Crossing story. It's extremely well done and I'm glad to discuss how it was received in Norway as well as accuracies and inaccuracies in the PBS production.

Setup begins on Friday, October 6th at 2:00 pm. Help is needed on Friday for setting up tables, chairs, etc. and in the kitchen for prep work additionally organizing the bake sale. Help is especially needed early Saturday morning (6:30 am - 7:00 AM at the latest) as well as during the breakfast. There will be clean up from 11 AM to 12 noon.
