**About the speaker:** Chris Johnson serves as President / CEO of Vesterheim, the National Norwegian-American Museum & Folk Art School. Born and raised in northeast lowa, Chris remembers visiting Vesterheim as a child on school field trips. He has worked in the museum field for more than 30 years, holding positions at places such as Living History Farms, Arbor Lodge State Historic Site, and the State Historical Society of North Dakota. Chris is excited to provide you with this presentation about Vesterheim's strong roots and bold future.

# From the August Program: The History Alive Project

Dave and Ruth Amundson founders of the History Alive Project, described their journey in educating youth about the Norwegian history of the area. They present a series of lessons to Westby High School 9th graders. The lessons are hands-on,


searching settlers and local figures and visiting the Westby Coon Prairie cemetery. They also present to groups of all ages. Their collection of over 6000 historic photos can be viewed at the Westby History Hus at 218 N Main Street. The photo on the left is a reproduction of a women's basketball uniform.

#### September Program:

Oak Grove School was one of 115 one-room country schools in Crawford County and typical of the 6,000 in Wisconsin. In Country School Days, Larry Scheckel takes us back to his boyhood days, growing up with eight siblings on the family farm in the hill country of southwestern Wisconsin and attending the one-room country school out on Oak Grove Ridge.

Oak Grove School was the social heart of the community,

from the basket social in the fall, to the Christmas program, to the end-of-the-year school picnic. Learn of the joys and challenges faced by students in the country school. Join Scheckel on his nostalgic and evocative journey as he shares his memories of friendships forged and lessons learned during his eight years in a one-room country school with 28 kids and one teacher in a building the size of a garage.



Scheckel will use a PowerPoint presentation to illustrate why the one-room school was described as the best possible education for over 150 years and how the lessons learned could be applied to today's schools.

Marlene McCabe and her husband, John, attended his 71st Holmen Class Reunion in early August. John and Kent Sween and Richard Granum were classmates all those years ago. Sons of Norway came up in the discussion...of the 9 people present, 4 were SON members.

From **Ann Sprain**: "My daughter, Kathryn Schmidt, and I visited Norway with a 12-day tour group leaving July 24 and returning on Aug 4.

We were so fortunate to visit the Sør-Fron Kirke (church), also known as the Gudbrandsdalen cathedral. This church was attended by my paternal grandmother's side of the family (Kirkeengs) years ago. It was built of stone, in octagon shape with room for 750 people, in 1792. It was one of the few churches in the 1700's in Norway constructed out of stone. In 1956, the church was careful-

ly repaired and restored.

We were met by distant Kirkeeng family members and were guided through the cemetery to visit gravesites and spent some time seeing the Kirkeeng homestead (or what's left of it – the buildings are now gone but foundations remain). The Custodian opened the church and gave us an informational history of the church. We were gifted with a



book on the history of the church (in Norwegian) and a Christmas ornament with a photo of Sør-Fron Kirke on it.

It was such a great trip, one that will remain close at heart forever!"

A pandemic-related baby boom has sent Norwegian families scrambling to find perfect names for their new additions. 2021 saw over 3,000 more births in Norway than in 2020. Thankfully, help has come from an entity with a long history flaunting imaginative naming skills: IKEA.

Employees at the Norwegian branch of the Swedish retail giant combed through its catalogs, curating a "name bank" overflowing with over 800 monikers inspired by over 70 years of flat-pack tables, chairs, chandeliers, desks, and a mishmash of other household staples.

While many IKEA product labels are inspired by Swedish place names, several others have appellations associated with humans. They range from the more typical, such as Billy, a strikingly modern black and white chair from 1970, to the more exotic such as Ulrika, a dainty side table available in 1958. The names are accompanied on the website by a picture of the item, the year it was introduced, and a description in Norwegian. #### Norwegians Cancel Trips Due to Hot Weather

An insurance company says that Norwegians are considering canceling their vacation trips. Many people are afraid that it will be too hot where they are planning to travel.

Spain is a country Norwegians love to travel to. This summer it has been extra hot. On Sunday it was close to 43 degrees [Celsius -  $109^{\circ}$  F].

This makes people consider canceling their vacations. This is according to insurance company IF. They have already

been asked if it is possible to receive refunds through insurance.

IF says that heat is not covered by insurance.

"If you are worried about the heat, then there is no reason to cancel. But if you go on the trip and something happens, you will get all the help we can offer," Bjarne Aani

#### **Norwegian Cinnamon Thumbs**

These delicious shortbread cookies rolled in cinnamon sugar are a perfect little treat with a cup of coffee!

#### **Cookie Ingredients:**

5 Tbsp. sugar1 cup butter2 cups flour

1 tsp. vanilla

# Ingredients for rolling:

1 tsp. cinnamon 1/4 cup sugar



#### **Directions:**

Preheat the oven to 350°F.

To make the cookies, beat the sugar and butter together until fluffy. Add the flour and vanilla, and beat until the dough comes together.

Take a small amount of dough (about the size of a tennis ball), and roll is gently into a long, skinny rope 1/2" in diameter (about the width of your pinky). Using a sharp knife, cut the dough into 2" pieces, making sure to cut on the diagonal instead of straight across.

Place cookies a few inches apart on a lined baking sheet, and bake 8-10 minutes, until just beginning to turn golden on the bottom edges. Remove cookies from oven and allow to cool slightly.

While cookies are cooling, combine the cinnamon and sugar for rolling in a small bowl. When cookies are cool enough to handle, roll each one gently in the cinnamon sugar, and place on a cooling rack to finish cooling.
