Minutes March 7, 2019 General Lodge Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 6:48 by President Dave Glomstad. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the three national anthems were sang.

The Charter was draped in memory of Richard Fonstad and a moment of silence was observed. One guest was introduced by Lee Grippen; Ju Sub Kim of South Korea.

Officers for 2019 were installed that missed the January meeting. They were Adrian Johnson, Secretary; Ramona Johnson, Vice President; Mark Dregne, Treasurer; Dee Johnson, Auditor; Fred Johnson, Marshal; Arlen Henderson, Marshall; Ilene Pavelko, Co-Foundation Director; Carole Wadel, Greeter/Raffel Sales.

Foundation Cans were distributed. April lunch sign up sheets were distributed. Budstikken clip boards were distributed.

Treasurers report was given by Mark Dregne. General fund has a balance of \$5484.60. Memorial fund has a balance of \$1656.38. Scholarship fund has a balance of \$2549.50. Savings account has a balance of \$18354.10. Total financial assets of \$28,044.58.

Ramona announced the details of the May 2 Syttende May Banquet. To be held at Drugans at 5 PM social hour and 6 PM dinner. Tickets are available tonight for \$20.00 and will be also available at our April meeting. After that Dee Johnson will need to be contacted for tickets. The Budstikken was delivered late this month due to a problem with the post office in the Twin Cities.

Our goal for 2019 is 17 new members. Our membership has dropped from nearly 500 to just over 300 at the end of 2018.


The raffle was won by Fred Johnson and Skip Tempte. \$26.00 each.

The program was presented by Skip Temte and his daughter Kristin Krug about their five month trip around the world by cruise ship.


There were 49 adults in attendance. Lunch money collected was \$125.75. \$32.86 for the SON Foundation and \$52.00 from the raffle.

They will be in bunads and it should also be very educational. You can check out Karen's website by going to: <http://karenrebholz.weebly.com/>





Looking Back

Fem år siden (5 years ago) 2014

The April meeting featured a program titled "How to Preserve our Ancestors' Gravestones", by Jarrod Roll. Mr. Roll is a museum director and public speaker with several years of gravestone cleaning experience. He started his own business, Save Your Stones, and created a Gravestone Cleaning Kit, to help families effectively clean and preserve their family's burial markers.

Norskedalen celebrated its 30th year of its organization and celebration of the cultural heritage of our area. The annual Norskedalen Award was presented posthumously to James H. Warner. He was a former Norskedalen board member, and since the organization's beginning had been a visionary, steward, donor and volunteer. The Coulee Chordsmen provided entertainment and shared stories of Jim, who had been a member of the musical group.

Ti år siden (10 years ago) 2009

Rob Quanbeck, from Moorhead, MN, presented the April program about the Concordia Language Camps. Concor-

dia College began the camps as an immersion experience in learning a new language. They began with German and Norwegian; however, they've now expanded to include Russian, French, Spanish, Chinese, Arabic, and others as well. Most camps are in northern Minnesota, but others operate all over the world. His program also focused on the importance of Sons of Norway involvement.

KVARTS (Norwegian for "quartz"), one of Norway's best known traditional music bands, visited the Upper Midwest in March and April. They presented a series of performances in Minnesota, Iowa, and Wisconsin, and did an instrumental workshop at Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, Iowa. The group is comprised of instrumentalists, music educators, composers, and arrangers.

Femten år siden (15 years ago) 2004

Charles Hulsether, a woodcarver from Viroqua, presented the April program entitled "Norwegian Folk Art in Wood". He shared the history of the Geometric Style (chip carving) and the Organic Style (Acanthus carving), and spoke about how each has been handed down through the centuries.

Tiny Almond Pies

Top off your Easter supper with this tasty dessert, laced with delicate almond flavor.

For the dough:

Scant 2/3 cup unsalted butter
1 cup flour, sifted
1 egg yolk
3 1/2 Tbsp. cold water
1 Tbsp. cognac



For the filling:

1 1/4 cups ground almonds
1 cup sifted confectioner's sugar
3 egg whites, lightly beaten

1. Divide the butter into three pieces of equal size. Crumble one piece into the flour.
2. Whisk the egg yolk into the water and add. Knead lightly and form into a square. Wrap in plastic and refrigerate 30 minutes. Let the remaining butter rest at room temperature. Sprinkle the baking surface with flour. Roll the dough out into a thin rectangular. Spread half the remaining butter over 2/3 of the dough.

3. Fold over the plain section, then fold over the other section with butter, like a business letter. This forms a rectangle with three layers of dough and two of butter. Roll into a rectangle and fold into thirds again. Refrigerate 30 minutes.
4. Roll out the dough and spread with the remaining margarine. Fold into thirds, roll out again and fold into thirds. Refrigerate the dough for 30 minutes. Preheat the oven to 400° F. Grease sandkake (small fluted pie) tins.
5. Roll the dough out into a 2 mm thin sheet. Cut into circles slightly larger than the diameter of the tins. Press into the tins.
6. For the filling, combine almonds with powdered sugar and egg whites. Place about 1 1/2 teaspoons of filling in each form.
7. Cut out 1/3" strips of dough and arrange in an "x" over the filling. Tuck the ends between the filling and the crust.
8. Bake on a baking sheet on the lowest oven shelf about 20 minutes. Makes 12-14 cakes.

A little in English...

Archaeologists Find Over 9,000 Year-Old Nut in Sykkylven

Archaeologists in Møre og Romsdal are very pleased with a discovery they made in Sykkylven this summer - a 9100 year-old hazelnut.

"The nut was partially burned. So either there was a fire in the area, or someone roasted nuts here about 9,000 years ago," county curator Bjørn Ringstad told Sunnmørsposten.

The nut was found during archaeological surveys on the Bakke Islands in Sykkylven this summer, on a site where a new school will be built.

"We also found nutshells in one of the fire pits at the excavations in Auremarka. Then we found a whole pit full of burnt hazelnut shells. But we have not determined their age yet," he says.

The nutshell found in the Bakke Islands was analyzed by a laboratory in the United States. Ringstad says it is a fun find, which proves that hazelnuts have grown on the discovery site for several thousand years – all the way back to the Stone Age.

Litt på Norsk...

Arkeologer Fant over 9000 År Gammel Nøtt i Sykkylven

Arkeologene i Møre og Romsdal er godt fornøyd med et funn de gjorde i Sykkylven i sommer – en 9100 år gammel hasselnøtt.

Nøtta var delvis brent. Så enten har det vært en brann i området, eller så har noen ristet nøtter her for om lag 9000 år siden, sier fylkeskonservator Bjørn Ringstad til Sunnmørsposten.

Nøtta ble funnet under de arkeologiske registreringene på Bakkeøyene i Sykkylven i sommer, på tomta der det skal bygges en ny skole.

Også ved utgravingene på Auremarka fant vi nøtteskall i en av ildgropene. Da fant vi en hel grop full av brente hasselnøtteskall. Men dem har vi ikke alderen på, sier han.

Nøtteskallet som ble funnet i Bakkeøyene er analysert ved et laboratorium i USA. Ringstad sier det er et artig funn, som beviser at det har vokst hasselnøtter på funnstedet i mange tusen år – helt tilbake til steinalderen.
