



Meltaways

1 c. flour

1/3 c. powdered sugar

2 T cocoa

1/2 c. butter

salt to taste

Mix all ingredients together until dough is moist. This takes a while but do not give up!

Once the dough is moist form into a small ball, roll in sugar, and then press down with a glass to flatten it. Bake at 350 degrees for 8 minutes or so. When cool, frost with powdered sugar frosting. Makes about 2 dozen.

Mint Meringue Cookies

Heat oven to 375. Turn oven off.

Put cookies in and leave overnight.

Blend two egg whites with 1 tsp. cream of tartar. Then add 3/4 cup white sugar. Beat until very stiff. A 1 tsp. mint flavoring and 1/2 to 3/4 c. of mini chocolate chips.

To darken, add additional green food coloring.

Something Lighter for Your Summer Table

Sugar Free Fresh Berry Pie

1/2 c. Splenda

2 tbsp. corn starch

1 1/2 c. cold water

1-3 oz. pkg. sugar-free strawberry or raspberry Jell-O

4 c. fresh strawberries, blueberries, or raspberries

1-9 in. baked pie shell

Cool Whip (optional). Regular Cool Whip has less sugar (2 g) than low fat (4 g)

In small saucepan, stir together Splenda, cornstarch, and cold water. Cook and stir until thickened and bubbly; Continue to cook and stir for 2 minutes more, then add gelatin; stir until dissolved. Remove from heat; cool slightly. Pour gelatin mixture over the berries. Chill for 4-24 hours. (After the gelatin mixture has totally cooled, cover the pie.) Serve with Cool Whip. Keeps well.



Sugar Free Apple Salad

one can sugar-free apple pie filling (with, or without cinnamon)

1-3 oz package sugar-free lemon Jell-O

1 C. water

1 or 2 tsp bottled lemon juice

Regular Cool Whip

Chopped pecans

Heat water until just boiling. Add lemon Jell-O and lemon juice. Stir until dissolved. Stir into pie filling and put into a salad bowl. Chill. Add Cool Whip, and garnish with pecans.

The Sons of Norway Foundation has a variety of duties and responsibilities. A major responsibility of the Foundation is to provide post-secondary scholarships. It awards grants to local lodges and helps to fund youth camperships which promote and preserve Nordic culture and support Nordic focused educational opportunities.

In 2021, the Foundation distributed over \$147,000 in awards. Included in this distribution were:

- \$111,000 in scholarships for students to study in the United States, Canada, and Norway.
- \$23,000 in Grants for Norwegian culture and heritage programs.
- \$13,000 for kids across the United States to attend Norwegian cultural camps.

In supporting the Sons of Norway Foundation through Vennelag Lodge, we are preserving our Nordic heritage for all ages now and into the future.
