FamilieTid: How To Get Along With The Hulderfolk

With Arna Rennan Saturday, August 13 11:00-Noon CT Free on Zoom - Register <u>here</u>

More than just stories from ancient folklore, the belief in the *Hulder Folk* is alive and well in the high grazing areas of Northern Gudbrandsdalen. It is a centuries-old belief that serves as an explanation for the mischief that occurs on farms as well as the practices for the protection of animals and farms. Instructor Arna Rennan met with Asta, Anna, and Ann Helen Brimi, shepherd girls on *Brimi seter* (mountain grazing farm) who shared their encounters with the *Hulder Folk* or "Hidden Folk." She also learned local folk songs from Jarnfried Kjoek that the *Hulder* sing to wake up sleepy shepherd girls to milk their cows. Gather the family for this special program that includes images, folk songs, and stories and draws you into the special life in the high mountains of Norway!

Arna grew up hearing Norwegian songs in her home that her parents sang – especially on Saturday nights with their friends. She studied art at the National Academy of Art in Oslo and has received grants from the Jerome Foundation, the Arrowhead Regional Arts Council Fellowship, King Olav V Cultural Grant, and the American Scandinavian Foundation to study traditional folk music and folklore in Norway. Specializing in music from Telemark, Setesdal, Valdres, Gudbrandsdalen, and Trondelag, Arna sings ballads from the middle ages, works songs, hymns, cowcalls, and more. She also plays ancient instruments such as the *langeleik* and *seljefloyte* (overtone flute).
