During the district conventions, delegates heard a compelling message regarding the years leading up to the July 2024 dues increase. Action Item from the 2024 District 5 Convention, taken in part, the passage of Resolution 2 and its suggested follow-up.

Therefore, be it resolved that the District 5 Board is asking the District Lodge to form a Task Force to review Masse Moro operations, promotion, recruitment, and staffing. The Task Force might also consider the wording in the Bylaws and consider giving the District Board options in how often, the length of camp, and other details related to camp. The Task Force would work with the District Youth Director, Heritage & Grants Committee, and the Board in their work and report to the District in June 2026 (or before) with recommendations. Amendment from the committee: 1) the District President shall appoint the members of the Task Force as soon as possible and that the work of the Task Force be ready for a preliminary report to the District Five Board no later than its Spring 2025 Board Meeting or sooner if possible, and 2) Therefore, be it resolved that an attempt be made to compile a directory of Masse Moro campers from throughout its history and that these Masse If there is a known, quantifiable financial impact, state here: Moro Alumni be solicited for ongoing support of Masse Moro through donations of time, talent, and treasure.

The Resolutions Committee's response to the resolution is in four parts:

3) The Resolutions Committee generally supports Resolution #2 establishing a Masse Moro Task Force.

4) The Resolutions Committee recommends continued District Five support of Masse Moro as a cultural extension and outreach from the Greater Sons of Norway organization within District Five and does not see the program from the perspective of a quid pro quo.

5) The Resolutions Committee recommends the Resolution's "Therefore, be it resolved," to read at the end: the District President shall appoint the members of the Task Force as soon as possible and that the work of the Task Force be ready for a preliminary report to the District Five Board no later than its Spring 2025 Board Meeting or sooner if possible, and

6) Therefore, be it resolved that an attempt be made to compile a directory of Masse Moro campers from throughout its history and that these Masse Moro Alumni be solicited for ongoing support of Masse Moro through donations of time, talent, and treasure.

Resolution #2, as amended, passed.

First steps: President Wille-Schlesser met with newly seated Youth Director Robert Schuck to lay groundwork for the task force.

This notice serves as a call for participants to join the Masse Moro Task Force. A few individuals have stepped forward to assist: former youth directors, Lisa Rove-Williams, Sandra Olson, in addition to me, and grandparent, Janis Wegner. I know there are many additional stakeholders who may want a voice on the Masse Moro Task Force, and we welcome your input. Please notify

President Wille-Schlesser of your interest in serving by August 15, 2024. After that time, she will appoint additional task force members and call the first meeting of the group. Tusen takk!

In other district news, President Wille-Schlesser will be meeting with Clara Solak, our newly seated sports and recreation director, on Saturday, August 10th. I will share information accumulated from past youth and district recreation events. I look forward to the infusion of energy Clara will bring to our board of directors.

Sons of Norway Membership Benefits you should try!



Genealogists, travelers, and map lovers have discovered this handy mail-order method of obtaining maps. All maps are produced by Statens kartverk, the official mapping authority for the Norwegian Government.


Road map of Norway Veikart Norge at 1:1,000 000 – Entire country of Norway.



Central Norway




Road map – Northern Norway – South

Membership Tip: Does the general public feel welcome to come to your events and meetings? You can use the tagline "The public is always welcome at _____ Lodge" on almost all of your flyers, posters, articles and other communications. You don't want them to have to wonder if they can come- they know it without asking!

Membership Tip- Take time at a lodge meeting (officer or full membership) to go over the District website and Facebook page and then the International website and Facebook page. Help members understand how to update their membership profile information, where they can find cultural medals information, sports medals, and all the other resources online!

Membership Tip- Make new name tags at _____ Lodge which have the town the member lives in and the year they joined. All members who joined in the past year and who will this year have a "New member" ribbon on their name tag. You can buy the New Member ribbons from PCNameTags.

Membership Tip: Sons of Norway is a fraternal organization with our insurance part playing an important service and financial part of our success. Invite a Financial Benefit Counselor to your lodge to share the products, services, Membership Event option, and other ways you can work together! <u>https://www.sofn.com/financial_products/</u>

Membership Tip- Does your lodge have a sunshine officer? Your sunshine officer can send out postcards to your older members for various holidays, thinking of you card, flowers in times of need or celebration, and other reasons. You can send out birthday postcards to all your members. Reaching out to all members during the year is important in keeping a personal contact to the lodge- regardless of their age or where they live.

Membership Tip: At ______ Lodge, you can have people fill out slips for our attendance drawing. You can give out candy, gift cards and other items at the end of the meeting or event. Then all non-members are entered into an MS Excel spreadsheet. You can highlight the email addresses to send out reminders about upcoming events. For those without email, you can send a quarterly postcard with our upcoming events

Membership Tip: At _____ Lodge, you can welcome new members this way:

- Send a welcome email (or hard cover if no email)
- Name tags for everyone
- Start a _____ Lodge Directory last year which goes through all our activities, how to update information, websites, and then your membership list (name, address, phone and email). In their new member email, you can ask if they don't want their contact info listed.

- Encourage your members to welcome them, sit with them, visit, and include them in events
- You can have a SN 101 one month for a program and went through the District and International websites

Membership Tip- Want to reach out to your older members who may not be able to attend meetings anymore? Julebukk to them! Have an officer run your membership list and then sort by age. Determine a good route for your julebukkers to travel and visit your older and shut in members- taking them some cookies and greetings from your lodge! Their membership is important too!

Membership Tip: Does your lodge recognize members for their years of membership? Pins are available from the Supply Service for 5 year, 10 year, 15 year.... that you can present annually!
