A few D63 reminders:

- If you don't have any changes or didn't elect officers this year, you still have to report. Just log
 in and to the Lodge Officer section, and at the top, click "No changes".
- If for some reason, your elections aren't until January. Don't hold up the process. Just check "No changes" for now and when you do your elections, then do the reporting. You can actually make changes throughout the year if you have any changes.
- You will need the membership numbers of the new officers to make changes so have that list ready before you start!
- If you have co-officers (especially President, Secretary or Treasurer), let the home office know which is the primary as they use one per lodge for important notices and follow up.
- What happens next?
 - Once all District 5 lodges report, Darlene will notify the home office.
 - Once all Districts have all their lodges reporting, they will roll over the website and then you'll see the changes.
 - Once that happens, the District Secretaries will get a copy of our complete officer lists and then I'll do the District 5 Directory.
 - If all goes as planned, the website should roll over by the second week of January and I'll get the directory done shortly after that!

4* <u>Deadline - December 31st:</u> Timely reporting of this information to Fraternal assures that your lodge's information will be correct in the Sons of Norway Headquarters database and in the online directory. Also, lodges meeting this deadline will score points towards the Lodge of the Year and Gold/Silver/Bronze merit awards.

If the deadline is approaching and your lodge hasn't reported its new officer roster, please submit the information you have and/or contact Fraternal. Changes made after the 12/31 deadline should still be reported, though these updates may not be reflected in the new district directories.

• NOTE: Your 2025 officer roster and lodge location changes will not appear in the
online lodge directory or be active in the Sons of Norway Headquarters system until
1/15/2025. Year-end reports and forms from Headquarters will be sent to 2024
officers.

Officer Updates Online

To Update Your Officer Roster:

Sign on to $\underline{www.sofn.com}$ with your username and password.

Click "Lodge Officer Updates" on the menu to the left of your name on your Profile Page.

To register your 2025 Officer Roster, click on the "Officers" button.

- No changes? Click the "No Changes for Upcoming Year" button at the top of the page.
- Adding a completely new officer position in 2025? Click "Add a new position" and then enter the title and member number of the person filling the office. Hit "Submit." Then hit "Save the Changes."
- To record a change in officer, delete the member number of the outgoing officer and type in the member number of the incoming officer. (The names will NOT change on the screen at this point.)
- If your lodge is **eliminating a position**, click the "Remove this position" button for that entry.
- Once you have made ALL your changes, click the "SUBMIT CHANGES" button at the bottom of the page.
- You will see a list of your changes. If they are correct, click "Save the Changes." Both Sons of Norway Headquarters and the District Secretary will receive a notification email
- Your 2025 roster of officers has been recorded.

To Update Your Meeting Information:

Click "Lodge Officer Updates" from the menu to the left of your name on your Profile Page:

- Click the "Change Meeting Information" button.
- Make your changes and click the "Save" button.

Julebukking: December's Trick or Treating



Although Halloween has come and gone, there is still time to participate in the Scandinavian Christmas version of trick-ortreating known as *julebukking*. *Julebukk* translates to "Yule goat" and was brought to the United States by Norwegian and German immigrants. It originated in Norway during Viking times to honor the god Thor, as he would often travel in a goat-drawn chariot. As part of the pagan celebrations, a person would carry a goat head, dress in goatskin, and burst in on the party.

Over the years julebukking has taken on a few different forms. It usually occurs between Christmas and New Year's. In one of the more common forms, julebukkers would dress in masks, hats, costumes, etc. and travel from door to door making their friends and neighbors guess who was behind the mask. They often would disguise their voices to make it even more difficult. Once their identities were revealed, they would be gifted candy, cookies, or holiday treats and continue to the next house. In another version from the early 20th century, julebukking involved dressing up with a group of friends, going house to house, and singing in exchange for alcohol. It's said that this version died out due to Prohibition. A more festive form of julebukking includes singing Christmas songs from door to door and is one of the more common forms of julebukking in present day.

Although some say julebukking ended in their towns around the mid-20th century, others boast that it continues to this day. In fact, it is still observed in some rural Midwest towns such as Stoughton, WI, Decorah, IA, and Spring Grove, MN. What these places have in common is a large population of people of Scandinavian descent.

If you've never tried julebukking or want to spruce up your yearly Christmas caroling, it is great fun and helps tie us to our ancestral traditions.

If you are lucky, the host will treat you with goodies or adult beverages!


What to take along? Here are some ideas!
