Rosemaling Class for Culture Pin #2 and/or #3

Saturdays March 12, 19, and 26, 2022 - 9:00 am to 3:00 pm CDT each day with a break for lunch Instructor: Lois Mueller VGM - This class will be taught via Zoom.

Cost: \$75 per person for the 3 days. For non-SON members Cost: \$100 per person for the 3 days.

This class is open to anyone, but much of it is designed to allow those of you who have earned your #1 Culture Pin to earn the #2 and/or the #3 pin. Those who were not a part of the class for the #1 Culture pin, may take this class as well. The instructor will teach you at your experience level.

The registration deadline for the class is February 26.

The classes will be based on the SON Guidelines for the second culture pin and the style of rosemaling to be taught will be the same as was taught for #1 pin. That was Telemark.

- Day 1: Review of brush control and brush technique for those who have taken the first class. For those who are beginners, we will concentrate on learning control and technique.
- Day 2: Begin to create a design for a 6-8" square or a 8-10" round. The square or round may be a piece of backgrounded poster board, a piece of canvas or a piece of wood. Beginners will complete a flower form and begin working with scroll formations.
- Day 3: Beginners will complete 1 project....an 8" round which will use the brush control and technique, flower forms and scroll formations. This could be a wooden plate or a surface such as the ones listed in Day 2 above.

To complete the submission for Pin #2: 1 elective selected from the list provided in the SON Cultural Skill Program information for desired pin should be completed including photos and unit evaluation.

A list of painting supplies will be sent as confirmation of your registration. You may purchase the items locally and/or from the source that is included with the supply list. Since you may have some of the items, you need purchase only those items that you do not have. Lois will be painting with acrylics, but is an experienced oil painter which allows you to select the kind of paint that you wish to use and she can assist as needed. If you already have paint and supplies, you may use them for the class.

Your instructor is Lois Mueller. She has been rosemaling since 1977 and teaching since 1979. She began teaching at the Technical College in Appleton, WI and now does travel teaching throughout the USA plus a trip to Taiwan and a couple to Canada. In November 2020, she taught her first Zoom class for the Illinois Norsk Rosemalers Assoc. and since that time has taught for Sons of Norway Dist. 5. Lois received the Gold Medal from Vesterheim in Decorah, IA in 1998. Since that time she has written 9 rosemaling instruction books. In 2016, she became part of a group that created a new organization called, Rosemaling Coast to Coast. The reason for the organization was to have a way of sponsoring a rosemaling convention. The next rosemaling convention is in June 2023 in Eau Claire, WI. If you are working for the #3 pin, you should be doing a 10"-12", 3-dimensional piece. You would also need to complete 1 elective selected from the Cultural Skill Program listing. You may find pieces like this at Vesterheim, local craft stores, or from woodenware craftsmen. If you have a problem finding something that you want to paint, get in touch with the instructor.

Consider being a delegate to the 2022 District 5 Convention!

All across District 5, elections will be held in January and February as lodges elect their delegates and alternates for the District 5 convention. Some of your members may be sharing their experiences as delegates at your meetings so members are more aware of what happens at conventions, what their role is, and the experience they have had. To help new members and those without convention experience, here are some things to consider and share with your membership:

Who can be a delegate or alternate?

- You do NOT have to be a benefit member to serve as a delegate to the District Convention.
- Current District 5 Board members cannot serve as delegates for their local lodges.

Time Requirements

- The District 5 Convention is June 15-19, 2022 in Middleton, WI.
- Your delegates may be asked by the District President to serve on a committee. This would require
 them to attend committee meetings on the Thursday morning and afternoon (or until committee
 work is done and the committee is dismissed).
- The opening ceremonies will be on Friday morning. The first official business and seating of the delegates is also Friday morning and all delegates need to be in all sessions Friday and Saturday.
- As times and schedules are finalized, watch the District 5 website (<u>www.sonsofnorway5.com</u>) and future mailings for schedules and timelines.

What does a delegate do?

- Represents and speaks on behalf of your lodge on District business, resolutions, proposed changes
- Accepts your lodge's recognition and awards
- Attends all delegate sessions, zone meeting (Saturday noon) and votes on behalf of your lodge
- May serve on a committee if asked to by the District President
- A delegate is the only member (along with current District 5 Board Members) that can run for the District Board (<u>if a benefit member</u> or if they purchase a benefit product at the convention).
- A delegate can run for a delegate spot for the International Convention (August 31th to Sept 1st, 2022) in Minneapolis, MN, <u>if they are a benefit member</u> or if they purchase a benefit product at the convention. The convention will be held, with first time delegates arriving on the 30th of August for the First Timers Training. Delegates will depart the 2nd of September.
- Learn about Sons of Norway by attending workshops, visiting displays and visiting with other members
- Bring back many ideas, activities and enthusiasm that will benefit your lodge
- Report to your lodge about what they learned, business conducted and report on elections held at the convention
- Have a wonderful time and go home ready to carry out the mission of Sons of Norway!

What is a Benefit Member? Someone who owns a Sons of Norway insurance certificate.

How do you pay for delegates? Each lodge handles this differently. Many will help the delegates with convention costs, registration, travel and hotel costs in varying amounts, paying it in full, or a portion. Some lodges will have a special fundraiser or event to raise money for delegate expenses.

International Vice President's Network Update from Cheryl Schlesser!

Six district vice presidents were in attendance.

International Vice President Mark Agerter shared the following statistics:

- Sons of Norway has experienced three solid years of membership growth with positive gains in 31 of the last 35 months.
- Our current membership stands at 63,027.
- D1 remains the largest district, with D3 in second place and D2 in third.

International Vice President Mark Agerter reported that the Sons of Norway's organizational goals were met in 2021.

The 2021 achievements included:

10,862 new insurance members, 290% of goal-1,415 in 2019 \$9.9 M or 272% of goal for new life insurance premiums-\$4.07M in 2019 \$12.5M in new annuity premiums, 143% of goal-5,985 in 2019 8,200 new members, 211% of goal-5,985 in 2019

The final numbers are not yet available for the new Foundation funds, but it is safe to say that we exceeded the \$264K goal by 300% or around \$790K.

One stock donation to the Foundation for \$1,176,000.00 is pending finalization. Another \$862,000.00 came in unexpectedly from a Minneapolis resident who passed away in 2020; that estate hasn't closed. Even without those two large donations, we would have exceeded our goal. Nearly 500% of the goal came in 2021.

"Forty-two grant applications were sent to the Foundation for 2022. With added financial donations to the Foundation, Connie O'Brien noted, we are feeling hopeful that we can fund a portion of each application. In addition, we are keeping an eye on Oslo Summer School; it is expected to accept students and hold classes in 2022. Applications are closed for that scholarship, but Emily Starks will be reopening and extending the deadline for Oslo Summer School to March 31st."

There are several lodges in the Order in various stages of disbanding. Some have indicated that they will be sending the remaining lodge monies to the Foundation.

Starting this weekend!

The Sons of Norway District 5 newest Zoom course, <u>Creative Leadership</u> will start with sessions offered on Saturday, February 5 (9:00-10:30 AM CT/10:00-11:30 ET) and Tuesday, February 8 (6:30-8:00 PM CT/7:30-9:00 PM ET). The course will be eight weeks long.

Weeks 1-2 will give you ideas on how to analyze your lodge's strengths and weaknesses, and to consider opportunities for growth, but also pitfalls along the way. You will learn to think about lodges comparable to you, and your similarities and differences, and the all-important need to rely on lodges volunteers.

Week 3 will focus on new ways to envision your current and potential volunteers. You will gain insight into how to develop hesitant on-the-sideline members into more engaged volunteers.

Week 4 will be show you how to accelerate your lodge's volunteerism program by matching needed the tasks you need getting done with your lodge volunteer's skills, and rewarding volunteers in meaningful ways. Ideas for developing lodge officers and succession planning will be discussed.

Week 5 will be cover developing a strong leadership team, by coaching, planning, communicating, using diversity and inclusion, and how to managing conflict resolution.

Week 6 will give you ideas for developing a strategic plan for your lodge, including knowing your member's opinions, making all lodge members "stakeholders," establishing attainable goals, using good communication, and being flexible.

Weeks 7-8 will allow participants who choose to do a project an opportunity to make a presentation on their work.

Faculty: Mike Palecek, leadership trainer, (Nordlyset-Racine WI, president); Dana Kelly, executive director of the Norwegian-American Genealogy Center (Mandt-Stoughton WI, member); Jim Herman, medical school dean (Edvard Grieg-Cincinnati OH, president); Corey Olson, project manager (Norsk Valley-Appleton WI, treasurer).
