- The D17 financial form is due from the lodges and districts to Sons of Norway Headquarters on March 15. Detailed instructions can be found here.
- Lodge Achievement, Family Lodge of the Year and the AFA year-end report forms are due to Membership Services at Sons of Norway Headquarters. We request online submissions using your profile page or the Forms section of sofn.com.
- D64 Lodge Property Officer forms are due to Sons of Norway Headquarters.

- D18 Building Association Financial Statement is the year-end financial report for the Lodge Property Association. It can be accessed from the Lodge Treasurer's profile page.
- 990 Form on the IRS website Most lodges can complete the 990-N postcard online on the IRS website. Lodges with an average income of over \$50,000 will need to complete a 990-E or 990 form. Please email us a screenshot of the completion page or simply send an email indicating your lodge # and that the requirement is complete.

D17 instructions

The D17 financial report is due to Headquarters on or before March 15. Please plan to submit this requirement via online system. Here is a review of the instructions.

You can complete your D17 online by loggin into sofn.com. Once you log in:

• Click on the word 'Profile' at the top of the page.

- Click 'Lodge D17 List'
- Click 'Edit' at the beginning of the line for the 12/31/2022 report.
- Enter your amounts in the correct spaces. You may need to scroll all the way to the right to see all the entry fields
- Type something into the 'If there is a major deviation..." Line at the bottom, even if there isn't a major deviation.
- Click 'Continue.' This will take you back to the list.
- To "sign" the report, click the word 'approve' near the end of the line for your 12/31/2022 report.
- Type your member number in the appropriate field.
- Click 'Submit my approval.'
- Here you can send an emailed notification to the next person who needs to sign the report, typically the Lodge President.
- Click 'Send Notice' and you have completed your portion of the D17.

IMPORTANT: the D17 Financial Statements MUST be filed online. We will not accept paper or emailed forms.

If you need a PDF version of this form, you can download it from the Forms area of the website.

Form 990 requirement

The IRS Form 990 (this includes the 990, the 990EZ and the 990N): must be filed by May 15.

The IRS requires all Sons of Norway lodges to file a 990 form:

- For lodges with less than \$50,000 in gross receipts, a 990-N (e-Postcard) must be filed electronically via the IRS.gov website. More information and the link to the Form 990-N Electronic Filing System (e-Postcard) can be found here: https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/annual-electronic-filing-requirement-for-small-exempt-organizations-form-990-n-e-postcard
- For lodges with gross receipts in excess of \$50,000 a form 990-EZ or form 990 must be filed.

Directions for filing the 990s can be accessed on the IRS website, or the lodge may choose to utilize the services of a tax preparer to complete and file the forms.

Once your 990 filing is complete (either the 990 form itself or an extension), please notify Sons of Norway headquarters by sending an email to taxinfo@sofn.com. It is imperative that you file this important tax form by May 15. Failure to file could result in an automatic loss of tax-exempt status for your lodge.

Sons of Norway takes this compliance very seriously. We have learned that it can be a very costly and time-consuming experience for a lodge to lose its tax-exempt status, and non-compliance of these reports could jeopardize the tax-exempt status of the organization.

Lodge Achievement and Family Lodge of the Year instructions

Lodge Achievement and Family Lodge of the Year reporting is due by March 15.

You can submit Lodge Achievement information via this online submission form at <u>Lodge</u>
<u>Achievement Form 2022 Survey (surveymonkey.com)</u> The site will walk you through the information you need to input.

If you tracked your lodge activities using FraternalsGive.org, you are all set. If you did not, you'll need to fill out this form.

The board now asks that all lodges submit copies of <u>both</u> the D17 lodge financial report and the IRS 990 form (due May 2023). Many lodges took care of both requirements at the same time. I regret this procedural change, but it gives our district the assurance that all lodges are in compliance.

From Across the District-from Idun Lodge, Madison, WI "Stoughton's William Seamonson and our Civil War Adventure Trip"



Mandt Lodge members John and Darlene Arneson will share the story of their adventure following the Civil War battle engagements of John's great-grandfather, William Seamonson. Born in Norway and immigrating as a young child, William went on to serve three years in the 23rd Wisconsin Infantry in the Red River, Vicksburg, and Mobile Campaigns during the Civil War. Follow the journey that John's investigation has taken as he shares how he researched his great-grandfather's story of service to his country and what resources anyone has access to in order to research their own family members. Travels took them to Norway, Camp Randall, the four southern states where most of his battle engagements occurred, the state capitol, and ending at his final resting spot at West Koshkonong Church.

International Waffle Day Approaches

Waffles are a delicacy that are popular worldwide. In fact, there are countless types of waffles from different countries, and they are served in various ways. The origin of waffles dates to Ancient Greece and they are perhaps one of the oldest desserts in history. The country most known for waffles is Belgium; the Belgian waffle is a thicker version of an American waffle that includes yeasted batter to make it light and fluffy on the inside, while staying crispy on the outside.

Another country that shares Belgium's affinity for waffles is Norway. However, Norwegian vafler are thinner, softer, heart-shaped and include ingredients such cardamom and sour cream. To add extra flavor, Norwegians are also known to add brunost—brown goat cheese—on top of their waffles for a sweet and savory combination.

What a perfect time to be dreaming of waffles, as International Waffle Day is coming up on **March 25**th. There is no doubt that Norwegians everywhere will be enjoying waffles on that day with their favorite toppings of cheese, jam, or sour cream. Join in with this delicious <u>recipe!</u>



Vaffelhjerter / Waffle Hearts

In North America, waffles are eaten for breakfast, and the waffle irons are round or square with four sections. The usual toppings are butter and syrup. The vafler in Norway are served for dessert or as a snack, in heart-shaped sections. They are richer and softer than American waffles and are almost always homemade.

Ingredients:

6 eggs

1/2 cup sugar

1 tsp. ground cardamom

1 1/2 cup flour

1 tsp. baking powder pinch of salt

1 cup sour cream

1/2 cup melted butter

3 Tbsp. butter for waffle iron

Instructions:

Step 1

Mix eggs, sugar, and cardamom together in a big bowl.

Step 2

Add in flour, baking powder, and salt.

Step 3

Mix these ingredients and beat in sour cream and butter until the batter is smooth. Let the batter sit for about 20 minutes before you begin making the waffles.

Step 4

Heat up the waffle iron and brush some butter on the surface of the iron.

Step 5

Pour 1/4 cup batter over the iron and wait for the waffle to become light brown.

Step 6

Remove waffle (watch out, it's hot!) and serve warm.

Step 7

Top with jam and whipped cream, or sour cream. Try different toppings and make a sweet or savory waffle sandwich!

Nordahl Grieg and the Norwegian Resistance

Professor Dean Krouk will describe the writings of the man who helped inspire the resistance during WWII, heralded by President Franklin Roosevelt and all Norwegian Americans for its daring courage fighting fascism.

Dean Krouk is Associate Professor of Scandinavian Studies.

Discovering your roots as a Norwegian American goes beyond your immediate genealogical chart. You must consider the deeper roots of who you are, your values and ethics. What were the values and culture of Norway that the immigrants brought with them and how did they change once they came to America and impact us as Norwegian Americans? How did Norway inspire us during WWII and shape our concept of courage as Norwegian Americans?
