Edvard Grieg Scavenger Hunt

Last weekend Edvard Grieg lodge held a virtual Norwegian scavenger hunt via Zoom. The important thing about the scavenger hunt format is that it is uniquely suited for virtual meetings, as it involves using items in our homes and sharing via the video and audio capabilities available in Zoom (or other meeting applications). Organized by our lodge secretary Kathy Skinner, the object was to see who could find the highest number of items on a list of 20 items related to Norwegian heritage or life. Kathy sent out the list a week before our meeting, with instructions (highlighted on the envelope) not to open it until the meeting (we also allowed people to join at the meeting as well). Once Kathy shared a few more instructions, she announced to 'open your envelope' and participants had 20 minutes to find the items on the list (you may wish to limit to 15 or 10 minutes). Being competitive Norwegians we all immediately set up rummaging around our homes for our items. We then tallied the scores (the winner receiving a gift prize of our D5 card deck of course), and then asked people to share the items they found in each category if they wished. The sharing was lively and fun, including a number of rare and unique items that were a pleasure to see and hear about. Sons of Norway Foundation - District 5

March 2021 report from Jon Tehven

2020 was a great year for the Sons of Norway Foundation. It was a great year because our lodges and members responded throughout the year, but especially during the Together We Are The Future campaign. The Sons of Norway Foundation Board of Governors thank you for your incredible support.

Since 1966, our Foundation has supported our members and lodges through scholarships, grants, and humanitarian relief.

In 2020, our members and lodges donated \$391,615. This included a \$90,000 legacy, a \$20,000 memorial, and a \$53,000 addition to an existing endowed scholarship.

And in 2020 the Foundation provided \$108,270 in 26 scholarships and \$27,330 in grants.

Donations to the Together We Are The Future campaign were \$210,164:

- \$ 85,561 for endowed scholarships
- \$ 17,013 for the humanitarian relief fund
- \$ 106,590 unrestricted funds

Donations came from 721 members and 113 lodges. Our lodges donated \$29,585.

In District 5, 25 lodges donated during the Together campaign, with another 4 earlier in the year, for a total of 29 lodges during 2020.

Foundation Board of Governors will continue October as Foundation Month, extending it as the Together We Are The Future campaign through December.

As we move forward in 2021, here are some things we are asking our lodges to do:

- Consider appointing a lodge foundation director if you haven't done so,
- Publicize the purpose and benefits of the Foundation in your newsletters
- Encourage your members to apply for scholarships and grants
- Support the mission of the Foundation

Always remember: The Foundation is here for you . . . for good and forever.

Maps in this presentation showed the correlation between tobacco farming and Norwegian settlement areas in Wisconsin. 

In Week 7 of the **D5 Norwegian-American settlement history course** we covered Crawford, Vernon and Jackson counties, which have some of the highest densities of Norwegian-Americans anywhere in District 5. Dave and Ruth Amundson (Solvang-Westby WI), the founders of The History Alive project, interested us with a history of Westby, Wisconsin, which is the city with the highest percentage of people reporting Norwegian-American ancestry in Wisconsin.


Want to have your newsletter online?-


