“Celebrating Norwegian Immigration - The Sloopers 200th Anniversary”

Schedule – Information

2025 is the 200th anniversary of the first organized emigration of Norwegians to the United States. The single mast sloop, “Restauration,” sailed from Stavanger, Norway on July 4, 1825 with 52 passengers on board. This group, often referred to as the “Sloopers,” left Norway for religious freedom and new opportunities. They arrived in New York City harbor on October 9, 1825.

The New York Quakers set aside land in upstate New York, near Rochester. After nine hard years of clearing heavily forested land to farm, they sent Cleng Peerson out west in search for better farmland. He and his group of Norwegian settlers traveled to Illinois and followed the Fox River down to LaSalle County Illinois.

Polar Star and Cleng Peerson lodges are planning to celebrate Norwegian immigration and the 200th anniversary of the Sloopers arrival in America, by presenting a 3-day culture weekend October 3-5, 2025. We will honor the history and culture of the early Norwegian-American pioneers who settled and established farms and communities on the Prairie of LaSalle County, Illinois.

Join us for a weekend of Norwegian fun featuring Sloopers and Fox Valley Settlement Pioneer history, Norwegian culture and craft presentations, Norwegian games, a fun Sloopers walk, a Norwegian barn dance with Norwegian folk music, a traditional Norwegian worship service, and a chance to meet descendants of those Norwegian-American immigrants at their Sloopers Society Annual Meeting.

The Culture Weekend begins at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, October 3 at the Community Center in Norway, Illinois, 3667 E. 2603rd Road, Sheridan (Norway), Illinois. The schedule below provides information about:

If you decide to travel on *Thursday October 2, the DAY BEFORE* the weekend events, you may wish to check out one of these interesting experiences on Thursday, October 2, on your way to Norway, Illinois:

- Spend the day in Geneva, Illinois. First, see the amazing Viking ship replica at the “Friends of the Viking Ship” Museum at Good Templar Park, 529 E. Side Drive in Geneva. <https://vikingship.us>. Tours on Thursday from 11-12 a.m. and again 2-3 p.m. Donation \$7 at the door but *pre-registration is required on Weekend Registration Form*. “Viking,” an exact replica of the Gokstad Viking ship discovered in the 1880s, was built in Norway, then sailed across the Atlantic Ocean, up the Hudson River, through the Erie Canal and the Great Lakes to Chicago for the 1893 World’s Columbian Exposition (Chicago World’s Fair). Don’t miss the ship’s splendidly-restored dragon head and tail on display in the Geneva Public Library, 227 S. 7th Street, Geneva. Then maybe have lunch at Stockholm’s Restaurant and Brewery at 306 W. State Street <https://stockholmsbrewpub.com>, and perhaps go shopping for Scandinavian gifts next door at The Gift Box www.genevaqiftbox.com at 310 W. State Street.

- Visit beautiful Starved Rock State Park in Utica, Illinois. <https://www.starvedrocklodge.com> In the Visitors Center, see the movie on history of Starved Rock, take a scenic hike up to the top of Starved Rock or to the waterfalls, take a tram ride, have lunch in the Starved Rock Lodge.
- Visit the LaSalle County Genealogy Guild, 115 W. Glover Street, Ottawa, Illinois. <https://www.lscgg.org>. Information about descendants in the area (newspapers, probate, obituaries, marriages, and more, on computer records, books, microfiche, etc.) Visit their website first to see what resources are available online. Donation at the door, but *pre-registration is required on the Weekend Registration Form*. Open Thursday from 9 to 4, and Friday morning from 9 to noon.
- Visit LaSalle County Historical Society, 101 Canal Street, Utica Illinois. Call 815-667-4861 for hours. Donation at the door.

If you decide to travel on Friday October 3, the first DAY of the weekend event

you may wish to experience one of these adventures during the morning on your way to Norway, Illinois.
(But be sure you get to the Norway Community Center in time for opening remarks at 1:30 p.m.)

- Pre-register for the “Immigration Textile Workshop - Sheep, Spinning and Småkaker” and sheep farm, from 9:00-11:30 at Esther’s Place at 201 Galena Street (Route 30) in Big Rock, Illinois. www.esthersplacefibers.com Learn about the pioneer art of turning wool into yarn at Esther’s Place! Starting with visiting the farm and meeting the sheep, you’ll walk through the steps of dyeing, carding and spinning the fibers. Then create your very own felted “småkaker”- using yarn as “icing”, you’ll draw a design on the cookie with needle felting, and then create a sachet ornament that is scented with glögg mulling spice and hung with a ribbon. <http://www.esthersplacefibers.com>. *Pre-paid, pre-registration is required on Weekend Registration Form. Fee is \$35.*

News from the Cultural Committee

Celebrate Norwegian Culture

"Sons of Norway is your destination for discovering and celebrating the rich tapestry of Norwegian culture . . . we have something for everyone." Sons of Norway website.

Nordic Trunk Information and Guidelines:

The District 5 Cultural Committee would like to encourage all Lodges to enhance their Norwegian culture experience by taking advantage of an opportunity for your lodge members. District 5 has a Norwegian Culture Collection in the form of three different containers (trunks), to assist you in discussing our heritage at your Lodge meetings. The trunks were created and made by Owen Christianson and contain examples of our Nordic heritage that have been donated over many years to these collections. The three trunks are identified as:

1. Viking Chest 2. Immigrant Trunk 3. Mini-Family Immigrant Trunk

The Viking Chest was the first trunk. In addition to the cultural items, it contains a written history of the creation of the collection and includes information about the Viking House located at the University of Wisconsin, Green Bay.

Each trunk contains different items representing Norwegian culture such as rosemaling, Hardanger embroidery, books, recipes, tools, cooking utensils, and much more. Included in each trunk is a list and description of each item, a list of suggested activities for sharing the items, and a space to document and describe new contributions.

Change in Trunk Distribution:

Due to the changes made in our By-laws regarding Zone Directors, there will be no set trunk rotation schedule. Now district lodges email a Nordic Trunk request form (see page 2) to the Cultural Director, Lucy Ghastin – leghastin@gmail.com. Members are asked to assist in moving the trunks from one lodge to another. Communication will be important between lodges. Our goal is to keep the travel distance as short as possible. This will be a challenge for the eastern and southern part of the district where lodges are quite far apart, but if several people who can drive can find meeting places, a trunk could be transferred with 3 or 4 drivers cooperating. When possible, District 5 officers will be asked to help with trunk transfers. The Cultural Committee will do their best to provide all three trunks to your lodge over a period of time.

Donating to the Nordic Container Collection:

- Lodges are encouraged to donate to the collection, write a description of their donation on the sheet in the trunk and email a copy to the District 5 Cultural Director.

-All donations to the trunks will become the property of District 5, therefore **NOTHING IS TO BE**

REMOVED FROM THE COLLECTION.

The Cultural Committee will distribute the donations among the trunks, so your donation may be found in one of the trunks other than the one in which it was originally donated.
