What's included?

- Cabin lodging with youth of similar ages, staffed by experienced counselors
- Three meals a day and healthy snacks provided with emphasis on fruits and veggies
- All meals prepared by experienced food service providers with suggestions from campers
- Naturalist programs provided by staff from **Beaver Creek Reserve**
- Night sky viewing at the **Hobbs Observatory** staffed by local astronomers
- Health services provided by on-site health professionals
- Specialized skills classes offered, such as wood carving, rosemåling, folk dancing, and Norwegian baking.
- Cultural skills pins through Sons of Norway International may be earned at Camp.

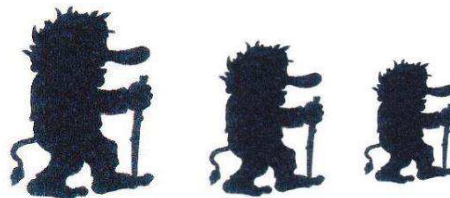

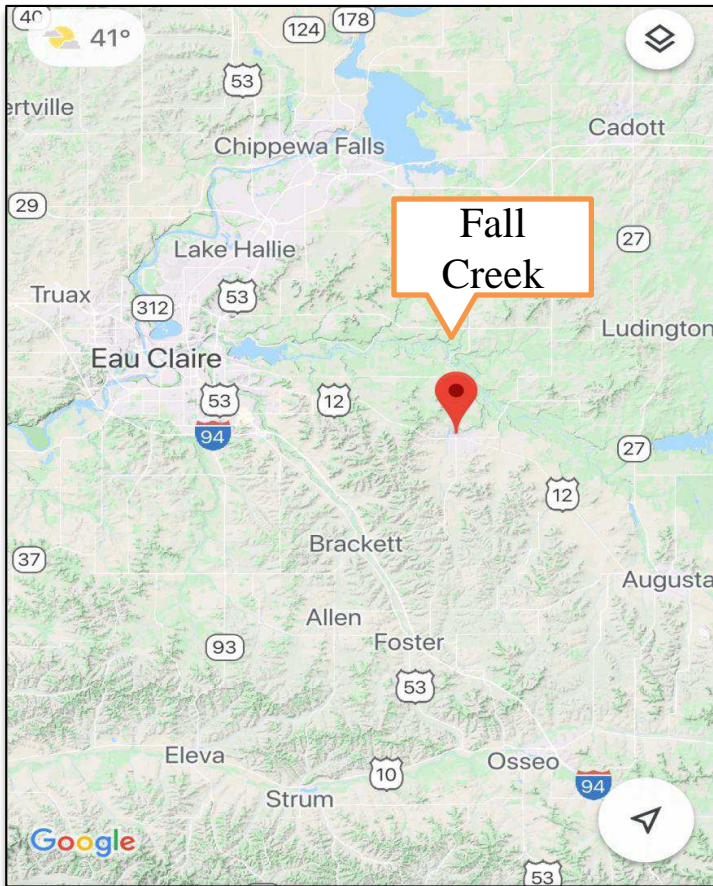

1st Day at Camp

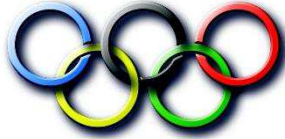

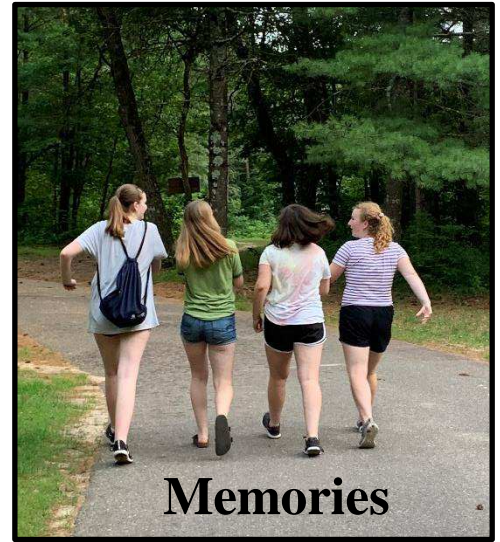
Memorial to Doug “Dag” Rossman

Douglas A. “Dag” Rossman | 1936 - 2015 |



Dag was a member of Sons of Norway, and was a counselor and story-teller at Masse Moro, a Norwegian Heritage camp in Eau Claire County, WI many times. Dag first attended Masse Moro in 1979 and felt that it marked a major turning point in his life. Over a two week period of evening storytelling, he created the “World of Norse Mythology”, peopled it, and carried it through to Ragnarok. Dag returned almost every year sharing Old Norsk Tales of Thor and Odin. Each year Dag is remembered at Masse Moro.
