### 2022 International Convention Update



The 2022 International Convention will be hosted in a virtual format this year, August 31-September 1. Though we acknowledge the loss of an in-person event, we are looking forward to this experience to celebrate our Sons of Norway membership. Delegates are being selected with the district conventions happening now and we expect around 125-150 to attend virtually. Delegates can expect a welcome box sent to their home in advance of the late summer date.

### 990s due to IRS by May 15

US lodges should file their 990 forms with the IRS by 5/15/2022. Failing to file 3 years in a row will result in your lodge losing its nonprofit status and fundamentally ceasing to exist.

If your lodge has annual gross receipts of \$50,000 or less, you file the very simple 990N postcard on line at <u>Annual Electronic Filing Requirement for Small Exempt Organizations</u> — <u>Form 990-N (e-Postcard) | Internal Revenue Service (irs.gov)</u>

If you have missed the May 15 deadline, you can still file the 990 until the end of the year. If you have any problems, please contact the IRS at 877-829-5500.

### **D18 Submission Deadline**

D18 Building Association Financial Statements. Lodges who own property need to file their D18 Building Association Financial Statement by 5/15/2022.

These can be filed online from the lodge Treasurer's profile page after signing on to <u>www.sofn.com</u>. An editable PDF version is also available to download from the Forms section of the website.

## Fly your Norwegian colors

#### and support the SON District 5 Nordic Legacy Foundation



When Norway became a sovereign nation in 1821, the Stortling adopted a flag with the Nordic cross, similar to other Scandinavian countries. In the early 1800's, some countries were forming republics to better represent its citizens, and the red-white-blue of France and the United States flags influenced Norwegian flag creator Fredrik Meltzer to include those colors in the flag design. At the end of WW II, Norwegians flew their national flag banned by the Nazis as a celebration.

The Norwegian flag is flown on these holidays:

Jan. 1 - New Year's Day Jan. 21 - Princess Ingrid Alexandra's birthday Feb. 6 - Sami National Day Feb. 21 - King Harald V's birthday Easter May 1 - Labor Day May 8 - Liberation Day May 17 - Constitution Day Whitsunday (8th Sunday after Easter) June 7 - Union Dissolution Day July 4 - Queen Sonja's birthday July 20 - Crown Prince Haakon Magnus' birthday

July 29 - Olsok (in memory of King Olav Haraldsson) Aug. 19 - Crown Princess Mette-Marit's birthday Sept - 2nd Monday (every 4 years) - General Election Dec. 25 - Christmas

According to the Norwegian flag law of 1898 (updated in 1927) the Norwegian Flag is raised at 8 AM, between March and October, and at 9 AM in winter months. The flag is lowered at sunset, but no later than 11 PM during the "midnight sun" times. In the far north parts of Norway, in the winter, the flag is only flown between 10 AM and 3 PM.
