# **Reminders for lodges:**

<u>The best weather of the year is now!</u> Plan meetings over the summer months and enjoy extended daylight hours! Consider organizing a road rally, a scavenger hunt, or a photographic journey. Use the natural spaces in your area. Organize night sky viewing with an astronomy club in your area.

<u>Variety is the spice of life.</u> Therefore, refrain from using the same activities consecutively. Instead, take the risk and do something different!

<u>Partner with another not-for-profit</u> and plan a youth event such as a Barneløpet in your community. Share the costs and the glory of the event!

<u>Pictures and more pictures!</u> Please take photos of your summer friluftsliv events and forward them to Karen Eberhardt, our D5 publicity director.

<u>It's Parade Season</u>-Make sure your lodge liability insurance is up to date. Check all parts of your float for safety issues. Make sure your tires and rims are street legal. Refrain from throwing candy from your float. Instead, ask your members to hand the treats to children by walking alongside your float.

<u>Summer Food Events</u>- Be sure to follow all local food service guidelines and be cognizant of any COVID-19 protocols. Check with your county's health department for further guidance, including any for lodge bake sales. Offer takeaway options.

<u>Form a Membership Committee</u>. Your committee should be meeting three times per year. Plan a recruitment breakfast or lunch at a local restaurant or your lodge. Honk your horn! Tell what makes your lodge a proud community partner.

We stand on the shoulders of those who came before us. Honor your senior members with notes and small gifts such as a plant, a bag of candy, bookmarks, or gift cards.

<u>Establish a virtual presence</u>. If your lodge does not have a website, consider a Facebook page. They are easy to establish and maintain. Check the District 5 Facebook page each Monday for membership tips. Adapt ideas for use.

<u>Educate prospective members</u> on why our organization is called the "Sons" of Norway. History matters.

<u>Send follow-up communications</u> to anyone who has visited a lodge meeting, one of your classes, or a special event. Create a database for these contacts. Send your newsletter to those who express interest. Postcards are a cost-effective way to send lodge messages.

Money back! If you plan to order membership pins, submit your bill for the *shipping costs* to me, and the district will reimburse you! Consider ordering your membership pins in bulk for multiple years. Reward your loyal members with this small token of appreciation.

<u>Member Surveys</u> give you an accurate picture of what your members want and need from the lodge. The SofN international website has a sample survey, but your membership committee could design one specifically for your needs.

WHEREAS, the Sons of Norway mission is to promote and preserve the heritage and culture of Norway and some lodges are promoting an inaccuracy by members wearing "Viking Helmets with horns" in parades, dramatic presentations, and pictures; and  WHEREAS, Elizabeth Nix, an Associate Professor of history at the University of Baltimore wrote for History.com that historic "depictions of people from the Viking era show warriors either bareheaded or in simple leather or iron helmets" and the only complete helmet from the Viking era excavated in an archaeological dig (Gjermundbu farm) has a rounded or slightly peaked cap made of four iron plates, a guard around the eyes and nose and no horns; and  WHEREAS, the stereotypical helmet with horns started showing up after the costume designer Carl Emil Doepler, used it in clothing Viking characters in the 1870s Wagner mythical opera series "Der Ring des Nibelungen;"
