#### Its officer election time in some lodges!

It's a busy time as we move into winter and lodge programming, recruitment, deadlines and the holiday season! So to help you keep on top of your Sons of Norway mailings and information, here is a summary of some of the upcoming deadlines:

**D63 – Officer Election Report**- This report was sent from the International to the Lodge Secretary. So if you aren't sure, ask your secretary. The changes are due December 15 to both the International Office and District Secretary (Darlene Arneson in District 5).

#### After your elections

- Ask your officers if their information on the membership base is up-to-date. Have them go
  online to update it or print a copy and bring it to a meeting for them to verify. If there are
  changes, encourage them to make them!
- Copies of the D63 form should be sent to both the International Office <u>and</u> to the District Secretary by December 15!
- Or you can update your officer's online by December 15. The Secretary or President have
  access to go into the Members Only section and update the officers. If updated online, I get an
  email with the changes. If you have officer positions that aren't listed on the website (special
  officers for your lodge), I will need to get those officers if you want them in the District
  Directory.

The sooner both the International and District get all reports in from lodges, the faster we can get the 2016 Lodge Directory completed. A copy of the new directory will be sent to the Lodge President and Lodge Secretary.

It is also important this year as 2016 is a convention year and we'll be corresponding with the new officers early in the year with the number of delegates and alternates your lodge will be electing. Those numbers are available in January so I need your updated officer lists so we send the information to the correct people!

Thank you for your help! My goal is to have the new directory done by early January.

# But we only elect officers every two years and we don't this year! YOU STILL NEED TO UPDATE THE OFFICERS AND MARK "NO CHANGES".

You need to still submit your report if you elect officers for two years and this is your "off year".

#### After elections are over:

- How do you thank your officers that aren't returning? Pins, thank you gifts, thank you notes?
- How do you train your new officers? Use the resources in the Members Only section. They
  have guides for all the standard officer positions! Attend your zone meeting or ask your zone
  director for help and assistance. Have your current officers train their replacements to make
  sure that all required items are done (990's, D17, D63, LA and FLOY and others) and that
  there is a smooth transition.
- Install your officers- You can ask your zone directors, other District Board members, or past District Board members to install. If not available, a past leader in your lodge could help.
- Plan for next year! There are many resources on the website to help with this! I really like the Healthy Lodge Checklist! Set your 2016 goals for membership, activities, and other parts of your lodge's programming!
- Involve your zone director and ask for help!
- Think ahead to the District 5 Convention and what you can do to elect delegates, support the
  delegates, and make sure your lodge is represented at the convention and District Lodge
  meeting.
- · Ask for help if you need it!

## **The District 5 Secretary Challenge!**

If all of our lodges submit their D63 reports to both the International Lodge and to me by December 15, I personally will give \$100 towards Masse Moro for 2016. I will keep you posted as to the progress. This includes having the hard copies postmarked by December 15 and online updates must be done so that I get the email on December 15.


- December 15- D-63 Report of Elections due. Send one copy to International Headquarters <u>and</u> one to District Secretary.


- Check correspondence from the International and District and the International (www.sofn.com) and District (www.sonsofnorway5.com) websites for any updates and changes.
