World famous violinist Ole Bull wanted to help the common Norwegian come to the U.S. and bought a large tract of land in the Pennsylvania wilderness to start a colony. Problem was that Ole Bull was swindled by crooked land agents who didn't really own the land they "sold" him. Ole Bull played benefit concerts to try to keep the colony going, but it eventually failed, and some of the colonists resettled in the Midwest, including northwest Wisconsin. About the Instructor

James started carving at age 11 under the tutelage of a supportive Community Education carving group. The members of this group introduced him to the flatplane style, which sparked his ever-expanding interest in Scandinavian culture as a whole. This interest led him to become the youngest Vesterheim Gold Medalist woodworker, teach carving classes, demonstrate in various small town events, and even travel to Norway. Since then, he has written several articles for Woodcarving Illustrated and an instructional book titled Whittling Flat-Plane Animals.

Class Description

This is a virtual class that will be offered over Zoom on February 4, 11, 18, 2021 from 6:30-8PM. The first 12 applicants will be registered, and any additional registrants will be contacted with future class possibilities.

Over the course of the three sessions, you will learn to carve a Norwegian red squirrel with just one knife. Instruction and discussion will be provided during class sessions, and further instruction will be provided through pre-made videos created just for class participants.

Topics that will be covered include:

- An overview of the history of Scandinavian Figure Carving
- Wood preparation methods
- General and specific carving techniques
- Sharpening
- Painting using acrylic paints
- Designing patterns

During demonstrations, I will have one camera on the work I am doing so that participants can follow along.

Guidance will also be provided for members seeking to complete Level 1 of the Figure Carving Cultural Skills Program.
