District Board of Director Status Update- October 20, 2022

It has been a challenging start for the District 5 Board of Directors. Leaving Middleton with the election of a full board except for a Zone 1 vacancy, we have had a number of changes that leaves us with more vacancies to fill:

- The resignation of our Youth Director- Elle Taylor. Elle was not able to find a benefit product that met her family's needs- which is a requirement to serve on the board. She submitted her resignation.
- The board then moved the alternate, Corey Olson, to the Board as a Zone 4 Director.
- Sandra Olson volunteered to move from an alternate for Zone 1 to the vacant Zone 1 Director position.
- During the International Lodge Meeting, District 5 International Director Robin Fossum was elected as International Secretary. That meant her alternate, Duane Kittleson, was moved from alternate to District 5 International Director.
- Recently, District Treasurer Nathan Nutter submitted his resignation due to work commitments and the time needed for the position. His alternate, Corey Olson, is already on the board.
 Corey Olson has agreed to move from a District 4 Director to Treasurer in January. Until that

time, District Secretary Darlene Arneson will be listed as the Interim Treasurer and work closely with Duane Kittleson and Corey Olson to maintain District financial matters.

So that means...

- We have to elect an alternate in Zone 1- they have priority alternates.
- We have to elect an alternate in Zone 4- they have priority alternates.
- We have to elect a Youth Director. If the new Youth Director does not come from an existing board member, we'll have some additional steps (go to District Lodge delegates to suspend the rules to have three board members from one zone and also elect an alternate for the Youth Director).
- We have to elect a Treasurer. Corey Olson has agreed to take the Treasurer position in January, so we'll need to elect an alternate to Treasurer and a new Zone 4 Director and alternate. The other alternate, Peggy Schroeder, declined moving back onto the board.
- We have to elect an alternate to International Director Duane Kittleson.

Who is eligible?

- We have asked the board members several times if anyone is interested in serving as both
 Zone Director and Youth Director. None have stepped forward. If someone would, this would
 be the easiest as we wouldn't have an issue with our bylaws of two zone directors from each
 zone.
- If none step forward, we go to the delegates who served in Middleton. Those eligible are those with a benefit product. Or a delegate willing to buy a benefit product.
- If someone steps forward as Youth Director, we could go to the delegates and ask for approval to suspend the rules of two directors per zone and a third member from a zone to serve as Youth Director. That officer would not have zone director responsibilities. We would need to elect an alternate for the Youth Director then.
- If nobody steps forward for positions, the new bylaws allow the District Board to fill the vacancy with any benefit member in the District pending successful vetting by the District Nominating Committee.

Lodge Development & Support and Zone Alignment Committee Update to the District

The District has two standing committees that the board members fill. Here are the roles of both committees as they had been separate committees but now are combined for this biennium.

Zone Alignment Committee: This committee shall review the proximity of local lodges and survey lodges to gather input and then present to the District Board, at the spring meeting or a timely manner for the nominating committee to perform their duties, prior to the District Five Lodge Meeting, its recommendations regarding the make-up of the Zones. The committee also helps identify ways to improve zone relations and representation.

Lodge Development and Support Committee: This committee shall provide help and support the people working to establish new lodges within the geographical boundaries of District Lodge Five as outlined in the Constitution of the Sons of Norway, the Sons of Norway. Working with the District Board, other District committees (i.e. Membership and Zone Alignment), the committee will also help to provide support, training

and resources for the zone directors, District officers, and local lodge officers as they conduct lodge activities, organizational duties, and work with membership issues.

The primary focus of this committee will be <u>dealing with the resolution passed at the District</u> Lodge Meeting in June:

#2: Approved: THEREFORE, be it resolved that the 2022-2024 District President shall appoint a Special Committee consisting of but not limited to current District Board members, past District Board members and District Members at large. The committee shall meet during the next biennium and present a recommendation of proposed solutions at the District Lodge meeting in June 2024. The Task Force should include diversification of selected appointees to include past, present, younger, older, different genders and from distant geographical areas that includes a more all-inclusive demographic appointee (s).

We discussed the different types of members we'd like to have involved and what the resolution outlined. Here is a basic summary of members we feel would be able to help us address the structure of our District and ways to improve it.
