

DECORAH, Iowa — Crown Prince Haakon of Norway will visit Decorah on October 6 to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the first organized Norwegian emigration to the United States, announced Vesterheim, the National Norwegian American Museum and Folk Art School, and Luther College.

Residents are invited to join in several public events during the Crown Prince's visit. The day will begin at 10 a.m. with a Street Festival Celebration on and around the Vesterheim campus. At 11:15 a.m., there will be a ceremony and ribbon cutting at Hanson Vesterheim Commons. The day will conclude with a Celebration Convocation at 1:15 p.m. at the Luther College Center for Faith and Life Main Hall.

Although there is no cost to attend, tickets are required for the convocation and can be obtained from the Luther College Ticket Office starting September 23.

The visit emphasizes the longstanding cultural and historical ties between Norway and the U.S. and aims to foster cooperation in business, education, and culture. This marks the ninth visit to Decorah by the Norwegian royal family since 1939, with the previous visit in 2011 by King Harald V and Queen Sonja.

Luther College, founded by Norwegian immigrants in 1861, and Vesterheim, which began as a collection of Norwegian American artifacts in 1877, play significant roles in preserving Norwegian heritage in the U.S. Decorah also hosts the annual Nordic Fest, celebrating Scandinavian culture. The 200th anniversary commemorates the journey of 52 Norwegians who set sail on the Restauration to New York City on July 4, 1825. Since then, nearly 900,000 Norwegians have emigrated to the U.S., with almost five million North Americans today claiming Norwegian ancestry.
