### DAY 1 THURSDAY, AUGUST 6

Chicago O'Hare-Bergen: Depart on your transatlantic flight.

### DAY 2 FRIDAY, AUGUST 7

Bergen: Arrive at Bergen Flesland Airport. Transfer to hotel. Balance of day free to adjust to time change. Welcome dinner and overnight at the Hotel Norge by Scandic.

# DAY 3 SATURDAY, AUGUST 8

Bergen: Morning sightseeing tour of Norway's second largest city includes a walk through the historic Hanseatic Wharf (UNESCO World Heritage Site). Afternoon and evening free to visit the famous Fish Market or ride the funicular to the top of Mount Fløyen for a magnificent view of Bergen. Dinner on own. Overnight at hotel.

### DAY 4 SUNDAY, AUGUST 9

Bergen—Fläm—Lofthus: Drive to Voss. Transfer to the Oslo/Bergen Railway and continue to Myrdal. Board the famous Fläm Railway, ranked as one of the top 20 train rides in the world. Descend 2800 feet within 13 miles from Myrdal to Fläm. Cruise the dramatic Aurlandfjord and Nærøyfjord from Fläm to Gudvangen. Meet the motorcoach in Gudvangen and proceed to Lofthus, located in the heart of Norway's cherry, apple, and pear orchards. Dinner and overnight (fjord-view rooms) at Hotel Ullensvang along the Sørfjord.

### DAY 5 MONDAY, AUGUST 10

Lofthus—Stavanger: Morning drive from Lofthus to Ølen. Visit a local rosemaling artist and enjoy a light lunch. Ferry from Arsvågen to Mortavika and drive the underwater tunnels from Rennesøy to Randaberg en route to Stavanger, the hub of North Sea oil exploration and development operations. Short sightseeing tour upon arrival. Dinner on own. Overnight at Radisson BLU Atlantic Hotel.

#### DAY 6 TUESDAY, AUGUST 11

Stavanger: Day free to explore Stavanger independently. This modern Norwegian city is a charming mixture of old and new, retaining much of its 18th century charm. Depart in late afternoon on a 20-minute ferry ride to a tropical island with beautiful flowers, palm trees and sea views. Tour the gardens and dine at the island restaurant. Return to hotel for overnight.

### DAY 7 WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12

Stavanger—Spangereid: Pass through Jæren, one of Norway's leading agricultural districts. Breathe in the sea air as you drive the scenic North Sea Highway, passing fields and ocean views, deserted beaches, and rugged landscapes. Stop in the village of Vanse, where you'll get a taste of America. Many Norwegians from this area emigrated to America to follow the American dream. There were many who also returned, bringing with them a love for American lifestyle, along with objects and traditions that have shaped the local culture. Possibility of connecting with members of a local Sons of Norway lodge. Dinner. Overnight in Spangereid for along the rocky coastline at the Lindesnes Havhotell.

# DAY 8 THURSDAY, AUGUST 13

Spangereid—Grimstad: Excursion to Norway's southernmost tip, Lindesnes. Learn about lighthouse history and coastal culture when touring the Lindesnes Lighthouse, the first lighthouse in Norway. (There are over 2000 lighthouses in Norway and at most there have been 150 in operation.) Since 1863, it has been the keeper's duties at Lindesnes to report around-the-clock observations of the weather for the Norwegian Meteorological Institute. Here, where two seas meet and currents, winds, and weather reion over life and death, seafaring history is full of dramatic tales of shipwrecks in the foul waters. When bad weather hits with full force, the waves can reach a height of 82 feet. Proceed to Kristiansand, Norway's 5th largest city and continue to the charming coastal town of Grimstad, known for its maritime atmosphere, picturesque white wooden houses, and narrow cobblestone streets. Dinner and overnight in Grimstad at Home Hotel Grimstad.



# FRIDAY, AUGUST 14

Grimstad - Vradal: Depart for Telemark, an area referred to as "Norway in Miniature." Enjoy a cruise on a segment of the Telemark Canal, one of the most beautiful waterways in the world, connecting the coast of Telemark with the interior through a system of 8 locks at a distance of 67 miles. Continue to Vrådal for dinner and overnight at the Straand Hotel.

# DAY 10 SATURDAY, AUGUST 15

Vrådal-Rjukan: Visit the West Telemark Museum in Eidsborg, one of Norway's largest outdoor museums and tour the Eidsborg Stave Church. In Morgedal, tour the Norwegian Ski Adventure Center offering an exciting DAY 13 TUESDAY, AUGUST 18 adventure through the history of modern skiing. Proceed to Rjukan for dinner and overnight at Gaustablikk Hotel.

### DAY 11 SUNDAY, AUGUST 16

Rjukan-Oslo: Visit the Industrial Museum and Vemork Power Station, where the Nazis produced 'Heavy Water' for their atomic bomb experiments during the war. Photo stop at Heddal Stave Church, the largest of Norway's 28 remaining stave churches. Continue to Oslo. Dinner on own. Overnight at the Thon Bristol Hotel.

### DAY 12 MONDAY, AUGUST 17

[B,D] Oalo: Morning sightseeing tour of Norway's capital city includes a visit to Vigeland Sculpture Park. Balance of day free. Farewell dinner and overnight at hotel.

Oslo-Depart: Tour ends following breakfast. Transfer to Oslo Gardermoen Airport for return flight.

### EARLY REGISTRATION:

To secure a seat on Exploring Southern Norway with Vennelag, Sons of Norway Lodge of Mt. Horeb, Wisconsin (August 6 – 18, 2026), please complete and return the Early Registration Form which also entitles you to a reduced deposit of \$400 per person (payable by check). As we are unable to secure airfare until a later date, pricing on the tour package is currently estimated. Once airfare is confirmed and pricing is finalized, you will receive a confirmed, priced itinerary, the applicable terms and conditions and information pertaining to travel insurance. To reconfirm your participation, you will also be asked to complete our Tour Registration Form. You will then have two weeks to cancel; should you cancel, you will receive a full refund of your trip deposit.

PLEASE NOTE: upon acceptance of the confirmed itinerary and price, your deposit of \$400 per person becomes non-refundable.

# AIR TRAVEL:

A limited number of group seats will be requested from the departure city specified in the itinerary. Options to fly from an alternate city may be available at the time of confirmation. A quote can be requested on your confirmation form. The supplemental cost will be based on published rates at that time.

If you prefer to make your own air arrangements, please ensure that the tour is guaranteed to operate, before committing to non-refundable/non-changeable airfare.



# **Membership Card Communication**


In July, Leadership Resource announced that Sons of Norway is going paperless for our membership cards – meaning that we will no longer mail out cards at time of renewal or when a new member joins a lodge. Most lodges will move to paperless membership cards starting September 1, 2025. Lodges that own property will switch to paperless cards starting December 1, 2025. This change is only to membership cards – renewal invoices will continue to be mailed out.

Members are encouraged to create an online account so they can access their membership card, and make other updates anytime through their online profile in the Membership Section:

# Celebrating Norwegian Heritage through Songs & Stories

Sunday, September 21 - 1:00pm at Trinity Lutheran Church



In the late 1800s and well into the 1900s, Madison's Near East Side was the hub of the Norwegian immigrant community. It's no surprise, then, that both Idun Lodge and the Edvard Grieg Chorus got their start in this neighborhood. The two organizations will celebrate on Sunday, September 21, at Trinity Lutheran church, where they both currently meet.

This fundraiser to repair their organ will begin at 1:00pm with a concert by the Chorus. Included will be a special selection of songs in both Norwegian and English. Adding to the festivities will be short stories and displays that celebrate the history of Idun Lodge, as well as two special landmark events: the 100th anniversary of the Grieg Chorus and the 200th anniversary of the sailing of the *Restauration*, the first immigrant ship from Norway to Amerika. The Norwegian American Genealogical Center and Naeseth Library, located in Madison at 415 W Main Street, will share some history as well.

Idun Lodge was established in 1908, seventeen years before the Grieg Chorus. However, Norwegian men's choral music in Madison started well before that. In fact, members of an earlier chorus founded the Grieg Chorus, which is now the only surviving Norwegian men's chorus in Wisconsin and one of only a few in the Midwest.

# "How My Ancestors Became a Novel" by Larry Sommers

Thursday, October 21 - Trinity Lutheran Church Fellowship Hall



Idun's October meeting returns to our regular Third Thursday evening schedule. The always-delicious potluck starts at 6:30pm, followed at about 7:15 by a fascinating presentation featuring our own member, Larry F. Sommers; a storyteller, blogger and author.

Larry will share his journey to understand his long-neglected Norwegian ancestors - a struggle that gave birth to an epic work of fiction, The Price of Passage: From Norway to America, From Slavery to Freedom.

At the age of 70 and retired, Larry reinvented himself as a literary lion. His first major project, after publishing a few short stories, was "an assault on The Great American Novel"

Inspired by his own Norwegian immigrant ancestors and by America's struggle against the evil of slavery, he crafted a unique, three-stranded story conveying historical truth by means of fiction.

"It's the hardest thing I've ever done," he said of this novel, "and also one of the most satisfying."

From the initial concept to publication, the novel took six years of the author's life. Along the way he learned some things about his Norsk ancestors, about authorship, and about himself. Larry will share these insights with a Q & A session afterwards.

# October 9 Landing Update

A message from Synnøve Rizo-Patron:

We are very excited about the upcoming 200-year jubilee coming up. The consulate is planning a large public celebration on October 9 at Pier 16 and Fulton street to mark the 200-year anniversary of Norwegian immigration to the United States and welcome the ship Restauration and its crew. This will be a free and inclusive public event at Pier 16 around 12 noon on October 9th. It is open to all; no ticket will be needed. We are working on a more detailed program for this day, and I hope we can share it with you later this week.

There is another group organizing a fundraiser for the boat Restauration and selling tickets to go onboard a Circle Line vessel in midtown, meet up with Restauration around the Statue of Liberty and sail together with Restauration to Pier 16 ahead of the public gathering we are organizing there. There has been a slight change in *Restauration*'s return plans. Shipping the vessel back to Norway via cargo from Baltimore turned out to be prohibitively expensive. Instead, the boat will remain in New York until a sailing crew arrives to sail it back. I don't yet have the exact departure date. What I do know is that after arriving at Pier 16 on October 9th, and following the festivities, the captain will sail the boat to Chelsea Piers Marina, NY, where it will be docked for approximately one week. Further details are pending.


